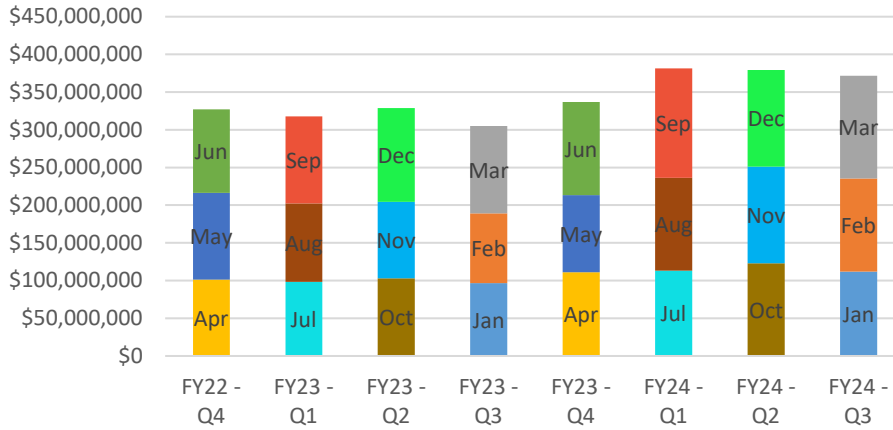
## Curry County



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Chart 1. Matched Taxable Gross Receipts Per Quarter

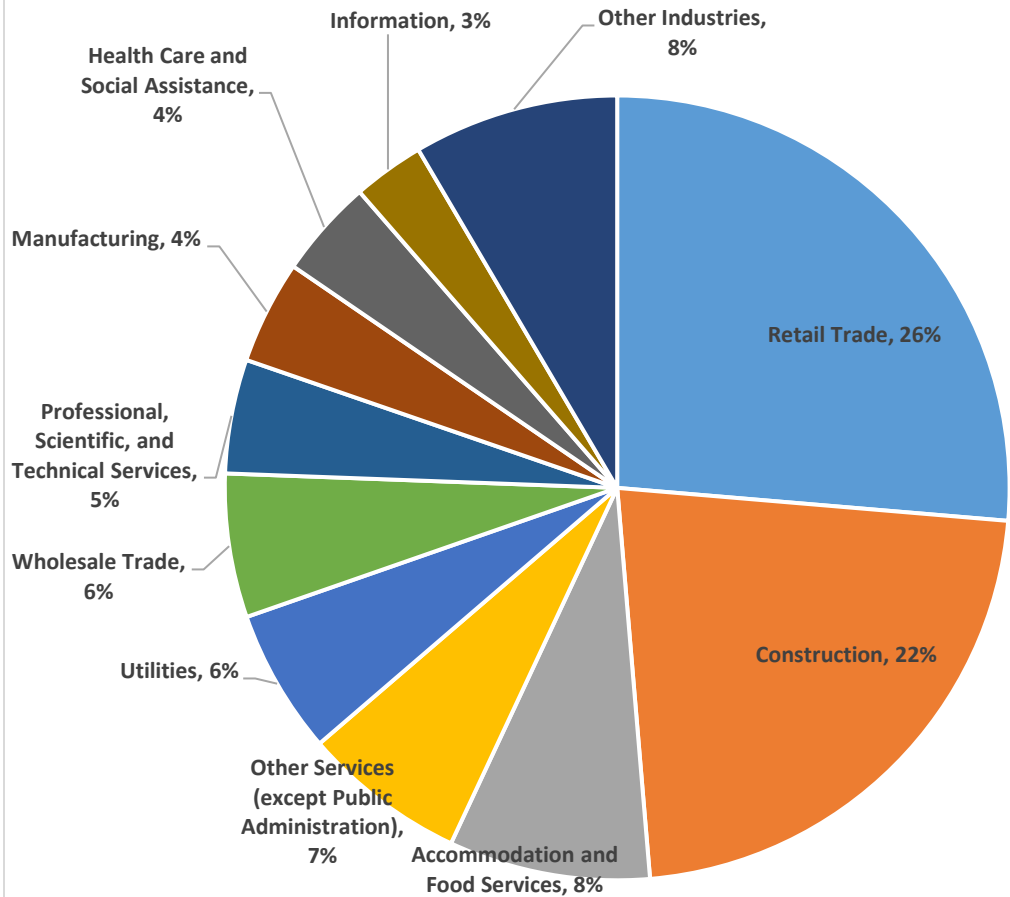


In the third quarter of FY24, 27 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth, with a statewide 8.5% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was seen across most industry sectors, with construction and professional, scientific, and technical services leading. As inflation remains stubborn, employment, wages, and the number of establishments are up YOY in New Mexico.

Curry County's MTGR declined by just over \$7.9M, or 2.1%, from Q2 FY24 to Q3 FY24, as seen in Chart 1. However, the amount reported during Q3 FY24 (\$371M) was \$28M larger than the eight-quarter average (\$343M), and MTGR show an overall upward trend. As seen in Chart 2, the retail trade and construction industries accounted for 48% of MTGR in Curry County, similar to the last quarter when these two industries accounted for 47%.

**Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR)** are the best tax data available to show underlying economic activity. The data collection process matches a tax payment with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.

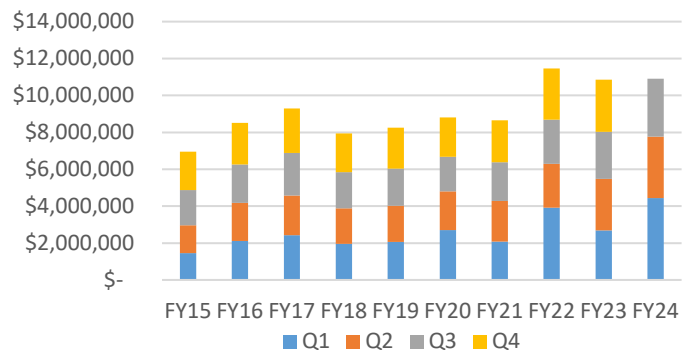

Table 1 shows that all but 5 industries reported a YOY increase in MTGR. The largest increase came from the construction industry, which posted a YOY increase of \$38.7M, followed by the wholesale trade industry with a YOY increase of \$8.6M.

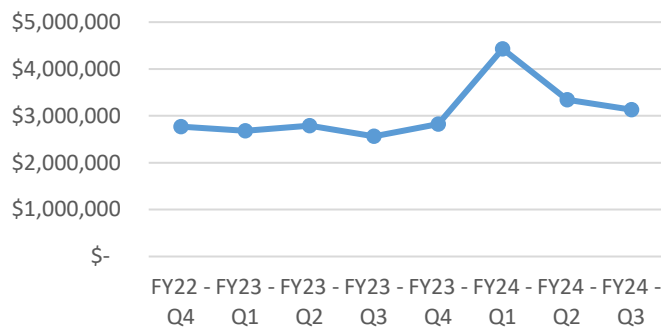
As seen in Chart 4, the quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections during Q3 FY24 (\$3.1M) decreased by 6.4% or \$212K compared to Q2 FY24 but were still \$64K higher than the eight-quarter average. Chart 3 shows that the total GRT revenue collections in Curry County, over the first three quarters of FY24, have already exceeded the annual collections of FY23.

**Chart 3. Annual Total GRT Revenue Collections**



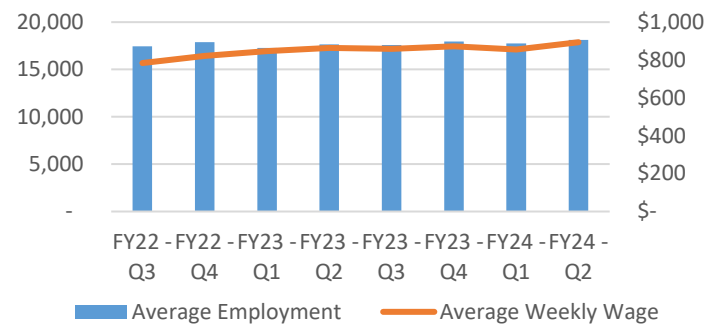

**Chart 5. Total Employment & Weekly Wage**



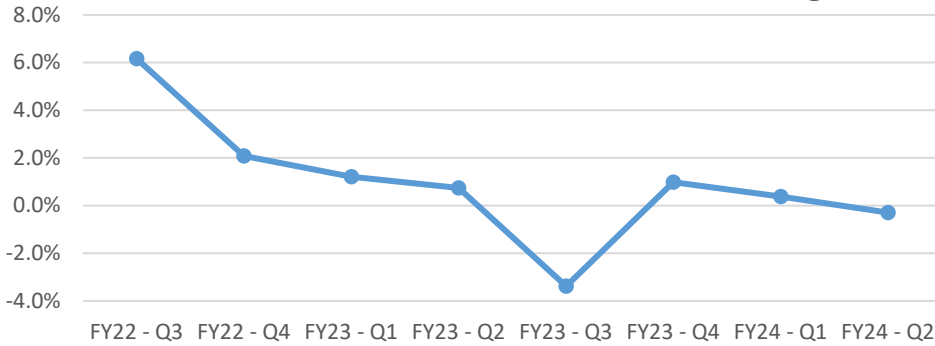

An **establishment**, as used in the QCEW and subsequently Chart 6 and Table 2, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, which produces goods or provides services at a single physical worksite and is engaged, predominantly, in one type of economic activity.

The **Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages**, or the **QCEW**, used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.

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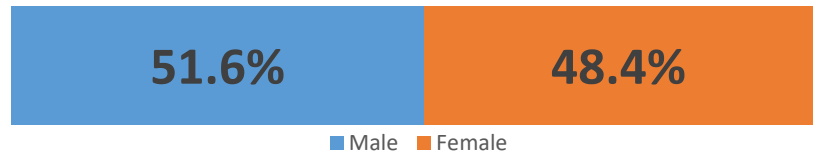

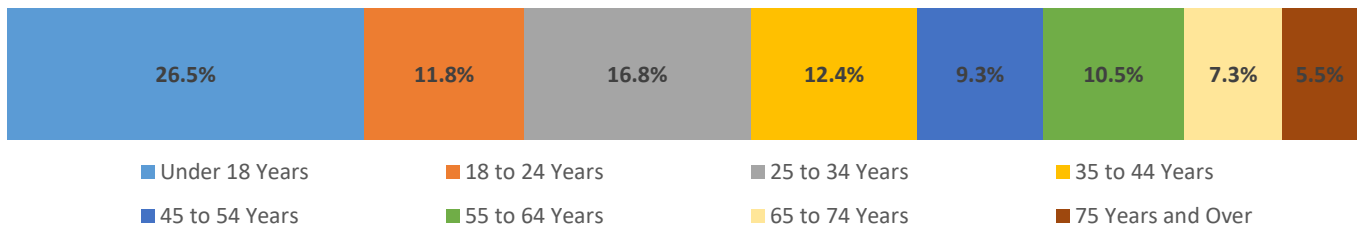

### Population Sex



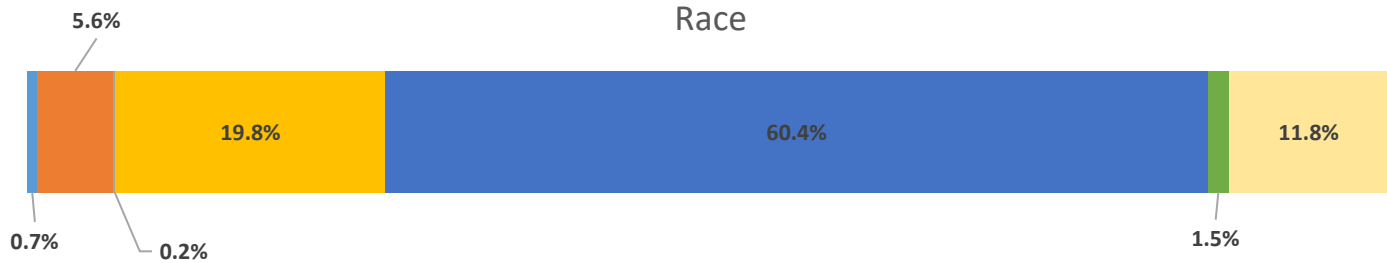

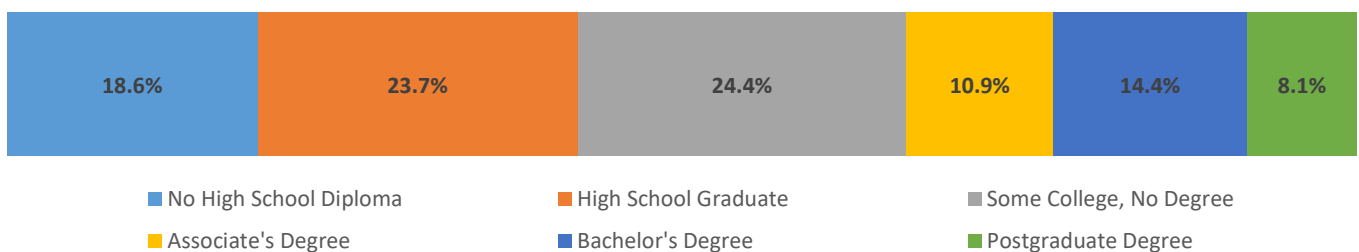
