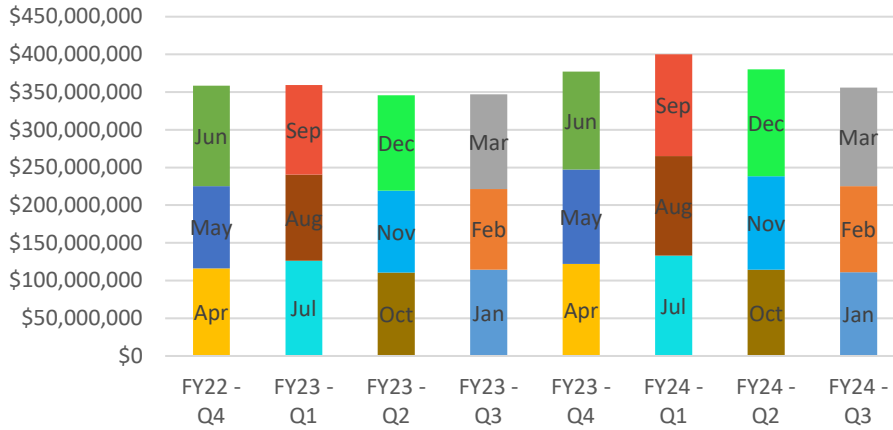

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Chart 1. Matched Taxable Gross Receipts Per Quarter

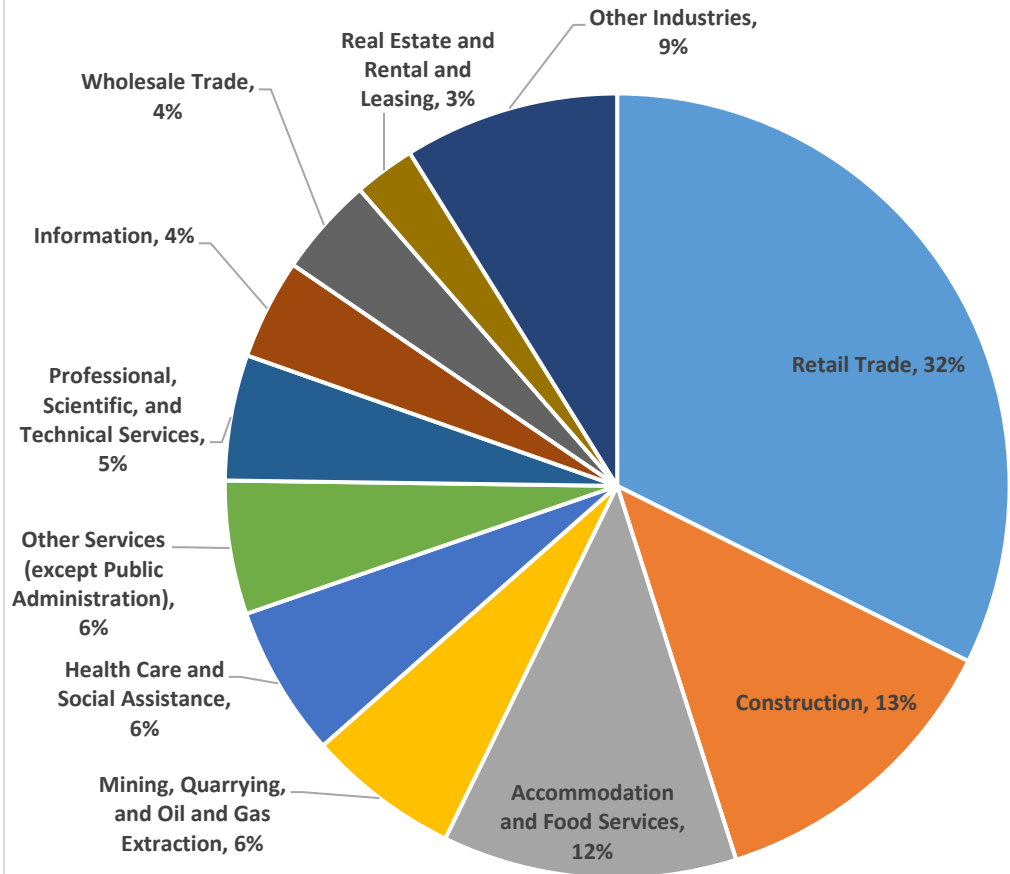

In the third quarter of FY24, 27 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth, with a statewide 8.5% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was seen across most industry sectors, with construction and professional, scientific, and technical services leading. As inflation remains stubborn, employment, wages, and the number of establishments are up YOY in New Mexico.

Over the last eight quarters, McKinley County's MTGR has averaged \$365.5M, which is \$9.5M more than the amount reported during Q3 FY24 (\$356.1M). From Q2 FY24 to Q3 FY24, MTGR declined by 6.3%, or \$24M. As shown in Chart 2, the top 3 industries were retail trade, construction, and accommodation and food services, accounting for 57% of total MTGR. These industries were also the top 3 in Q2 FY24, comprising 63% of MTGR.

**Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR)** are the best tax data available to show underlying economic activity. The data collection process matches a tax payment with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.

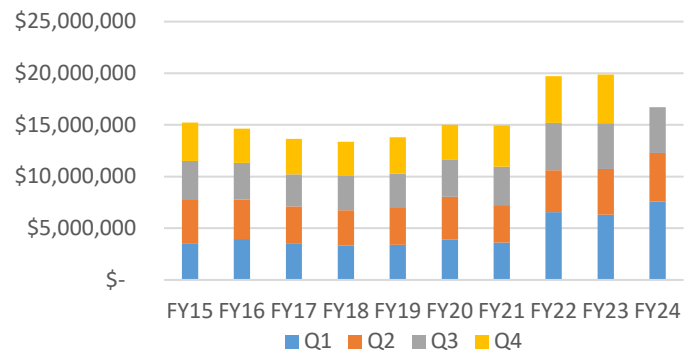

Table 1 shows that, when comparing YOY MTGR, McKinley County experienced a growth of 3%, or just over \$9M. Despite the \$15.2M decline in the mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction industry, the retail trade industry showed an increase of \$13M, contributing to the net overall growth.

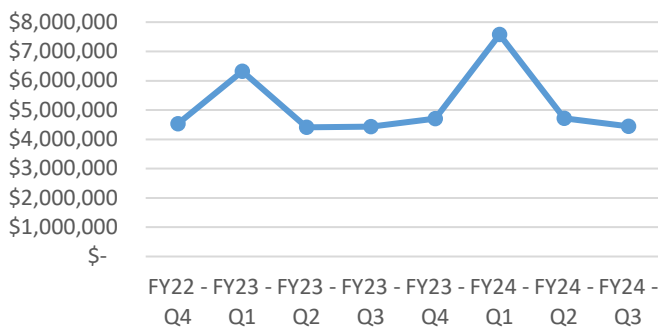
The quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collected during Q3 FY24 (\$4.4M) was 5.9% less than the amount collected during Q2 FY24 (\$4.7M), as seen in Chart 4. Chart 6 on the next page shows that the YOY change in establishments has remained negative, decreasing by 4.7% in Q2 FY24 compared to Q2 FY23.

**Chart 3. Annual Total GRT Revenue Collections**



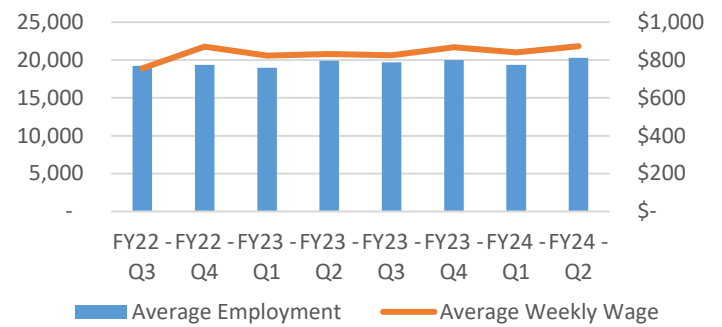

**Chart 5. Total Employment & Weekly Wage**



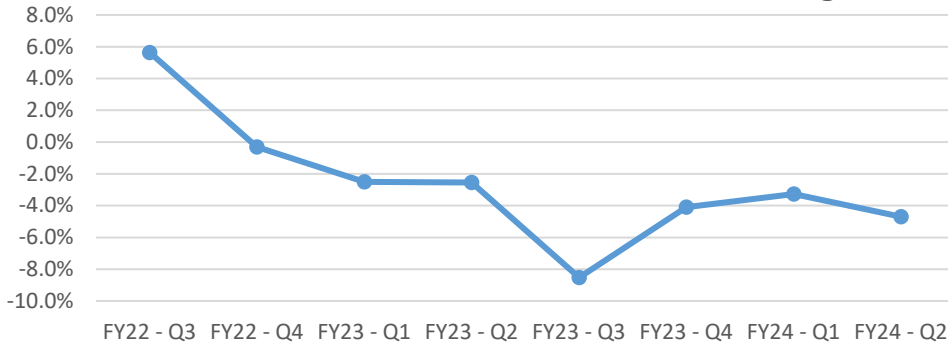

An **establishment**, as used in the QCEW and subsequently Chart 6 and Table 2, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, which produces goods or provides services at a single physical worksite and is engaged, predominantly, in one type of economic activity.

The **Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages**, or the **QCEW**, used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.

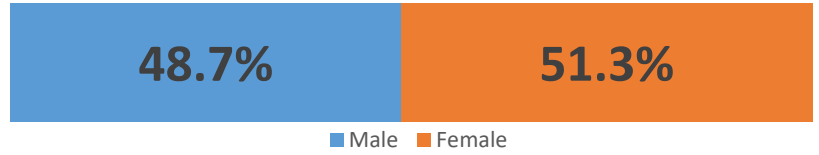

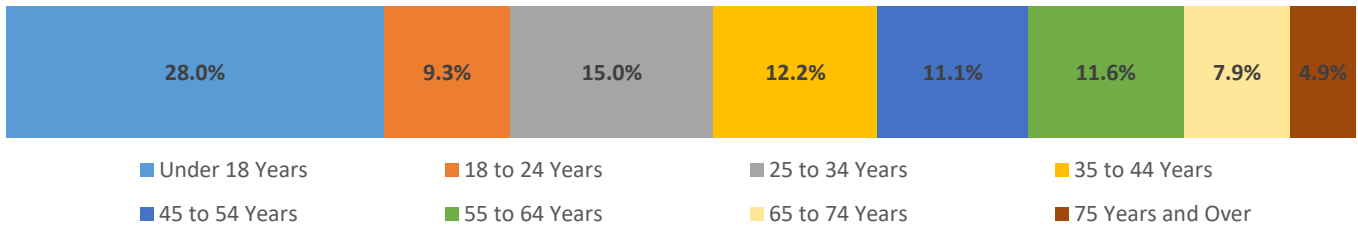

### Population Sex



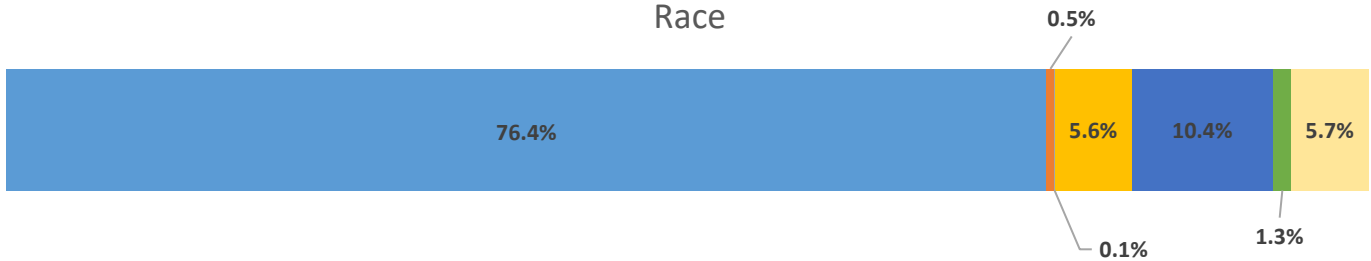

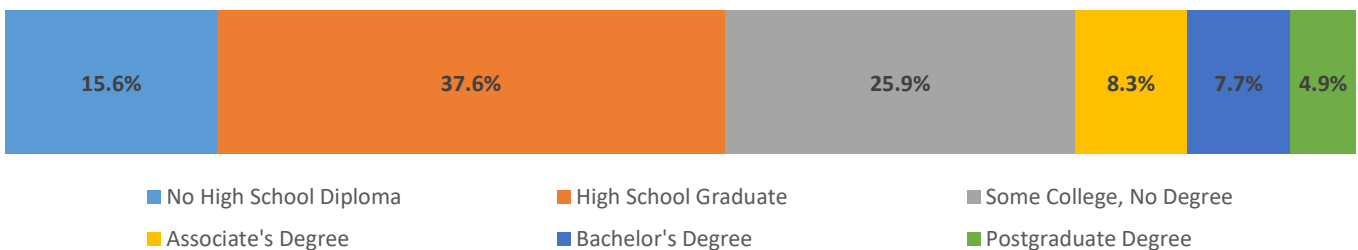
