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In the fourth guarter of FY24, 23 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth, with a statewide 3.2% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was seen across most industry sectors, with professional, scientific, and technical services and other Employment, services leading. number of wages, and the establishments are up YOY in New Mexico.

Cibola County's MTGR in Q4 FY24 totaled \$131M. This amount represents a \$7.4M (6%) increase from Q3 FY24, a \$2M (2%) YOY increase compared to Q4 FY23, and is also \$11.6M larger than the eight-quarter average (\$120M), as seen in Chart 1. The largest industry by percentage of MTGR was the retail trade industry, accounting for 26% (Chart 2). Retail trade was also the largest industry in the previous quarter, comprising 28% of MTGR.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) are the best tax data available to show underlying economic activity. The data collection process matches payment with а tax reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.

Table 1 shows that, when comparing YOY MTGR growth, the largest contribution came from the health care and social assistance industry (\$5M).

Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collected during Q4 FY24 (\$1.7M) was 6.2% more than the amount collected during Q3 FY24 (\$1.6M), as seen in Chart 4. Over the last eight quarters, GRT collections have averaged \$1.7M.

Chart 6 on the next page shows that the YOY change in establishments posted a 0.5% increase in Q3 FY24, with the number of establishments reaching 445.

An **establishment**, as used in the QCEW and subsequently Chart 6 and Table 2, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, which produces goods or provides services at a single physical worksite and is engaged, predominantly, in one type of economic activity.

The **Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages,** or the **QCEW**, used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.
