


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

In the fourth quarter of FY24, 23 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth, with a statewide 3.2% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was seen across most industry sectors, with professional, scientific, and technical services and other services leading. Employment, number of wages, and the establishments are up YOY in New Mexico.

Doña Ana County's MTGR increased by \$68.9M from Q3 FY24 to Q4 of FY24. Retail trade, construction, and healthcare and social assistance were the top 3 industries by MTGR in Q4 FY24, as seen in Chart 2. Table 1 on the next page shows a year-over-year (YOY) increase in Q4 FY24 of 7%, \$94.7M, or compared to Q4 FY23. The largest contributor to this increase came from the health care and social assistance industry.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) are the best tax data available to show underlying economic activity. The data collection process matches a tax payment with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.



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

Gross receipts tax (GRT) revenue collections increased by \$779K, or 4.6%, from Q3 FY24 to Q4 of FY24, as seen in Chart 4. Over the last eight quarters, GRT collections have averaged \$17.5M.


As seen in Chart 5, Q3 FY24 total average employment in the county grew by 2,080, YOY, equating to a percentage increase of 2.7%. Average weekly wages in Q3 FY24 experienced a YOY increase of \$35, a percent increase of 3.9%. Establishments in the county also had a YOY increase in Q3 FY24, growing by 3.9% compared to Q3 FY23.















An **establishment**, as used in the QCEW and subsequently Chart 6 and Table 2, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, which produces goods or provides services at a single physical worksite and is engaged, predominantly, in one type of economic activity.

The **Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages,** or the **QCEW**, used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).


Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.


