

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In the fourth quarter of FY24, 23 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth, with a statewide 3.2% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was seen across most industry sectors, with professional, scientific, and technical services and other services leading. Employment, number of wages, and the establishments are up YOY in New Mexico.

Eddy County's **MTGR** decreased by \$6.7M, or 0.2%, from Q3 FY24 to Q4 FY24, as seen in Chart 1. The amount reported during Q4 FY24 (\$3.6B) was \$287M larger than the eight-quarter average (\$3.3B). As seen in Chart 2, the largest industry as a percentage of MTGR was the mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction industry, which accounted for 37% of the total MTGR during FY24. Q4 Last quarter, the industry also accounted for 37%.

Table 1 shows that all but 6 industries reported a YOY increase. The largest increase came from the mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction industry, which posted a YOY increase of \$91.5M. The largest decline came from the construction industry, which posted a YOY decrease of \$9M.


The quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections during Q4 FY24 (\$25.6M), as seen in Chart 4, show a decrease of \$331K, or 1.3%, compared to Q3 FY24. The amount collected during Q4 FY24 is \$1.9M larger than the eight-quarter average (\$23.7M).











An **establishment**, as used in the QCEW and subsequently Chart 6 and Table 2, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, which produces goods or provides services at a single physical worksite and is engaged, predominantly, in one type of economic activity.

The **Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages**, or the **QCEW**, used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.
