







In the fourth guarter of FY24, 23 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth, with a statewide 3.2% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was seen across most industry sectors, with professional, scientific, and technical services and other Employment, services leading. number of wages, and the establishments are up YOY in New Mexico.

Sierra County's MTGR decreased by \$2.9M, or 3.4%, from Q3 FY24 to Q4 FY24, as shown in Chart 1. Chart 2 indicates that the retail trade and construction industries were the top 2 sectors, each accounting for 27% of MTGR in Q4 FY24. Table 1 on the next page shows that MTGR also declined YOY compared to Q4 FY23, by 14%, or \$13.8M, with the construction industry experiencing the largest decrease of \$16.8M.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) are the best tax data available to show underlying economic activity. The data collection process matches payment with а tax reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.






Gross receipts tax (GRT) revenue collections decreased by \$56K, or 4.5%, from Q3 FY24 to Q4 FY24, as seen in Chart 4. Over the last eight quarters, GRT collections have averaged \$1.2M, similar to the amount collected in Q4 FY24.

Chart 5 indicates that total average employment in the county grew by 142, YOY in Q3 FY24, equating to a 4.4% increase. Average weekly wages in Q3 FY24 also increased YOY by \$38, or 4.7%. However, Chart 6 on the next page shows that the number of establishments dropped by 2.1% YOY in Q3 FY24, marking the first negative figure in the past 8 quarters.



An **establishment**, as used in the QCEW and subsequently Chart 6 and Table 2, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, which produces goods or provides services at a single physical worksite and is engaged, predominantly, in one type of economic activity.

The **Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages,** or the **QCEW**, used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).


Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.
