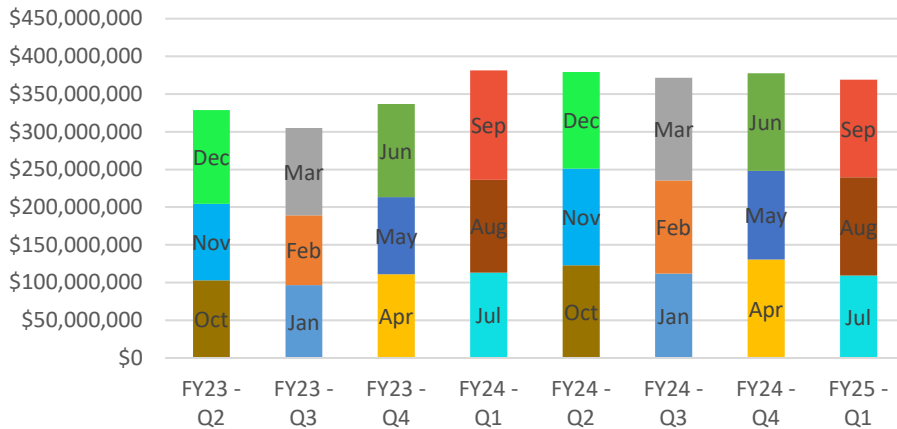

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Chart 1. Matched Taxable Gross Receipts Per Quarter



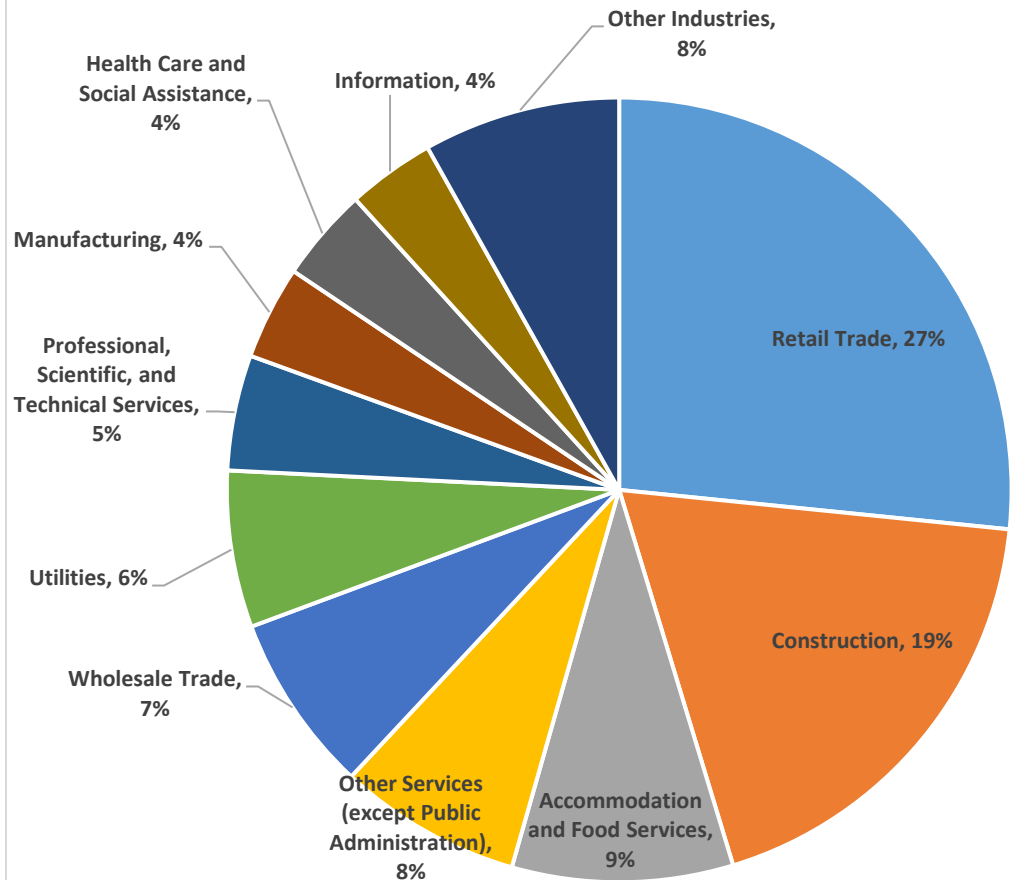

In the first quarter of FY25, 20 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q1 FY24, with a statewide 1.8% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was observed across most industry sectors, with the construction industry leading the way. Employment, wages, and the number of establishments have also increased YOY at the state level.

Over the last eight quarters, Curry County's MTGR has averaged \$356.2M, which is \$12.8M less than the amount reported during Q1 FY25 (\$369M). From Q4 FY24 to Q1 FY25, MTGR decreased by 2.3%, or \$8.6M. Despite this decline, MTGR in the county shows a stable trend (Chart 1). As seen in Chart 2, retail trade and construction accounted for 46% of total MTGR. These industries were also the top two industries in Q4 FY24, comprising 50%.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) provide the most accurate tax data for assessing underlying economic activity. The data collection process involves matching tax payments with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.

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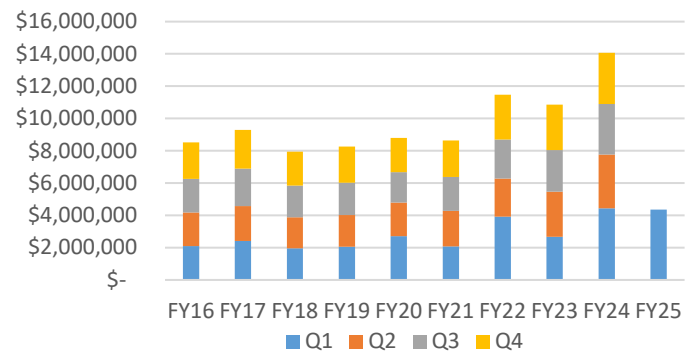

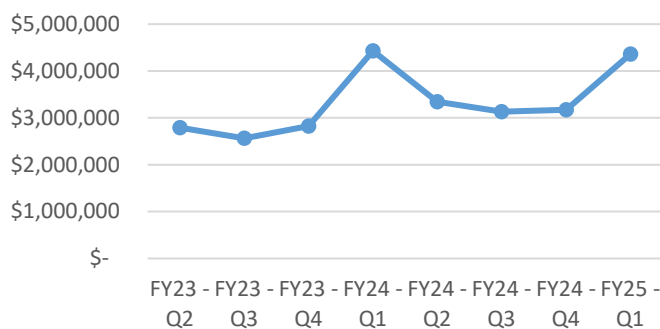
Table 1 shows that more industries experienced a YOY decline in MTGR than growth, resulting in an overall net change of -3%. While the information industry posted the largest YOY increase by \$3.7M, the construction industry saw the largest YOY decrease of \$9.9M. Compared to the previous quarter, quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections in Q1 FY25 grew by \$1.2M, or 37.6%, as seen in Chart 4. Total employment and average weekly wages in Q4 FY24 were 2.2% and 3.7% higher, respectively, than in Q4 FY23 (Chart 5). Establishments also increased by 2.8% YOY, as seen in Chart 6 on the next page.

Chart 3. Annual Total GRT Revenue Collections



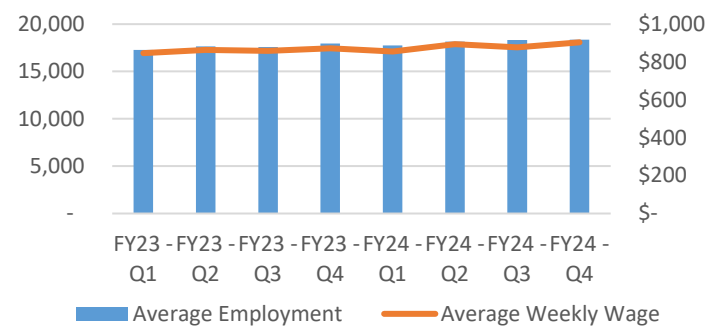

Chart 5. Total Employment & Weekly Wage



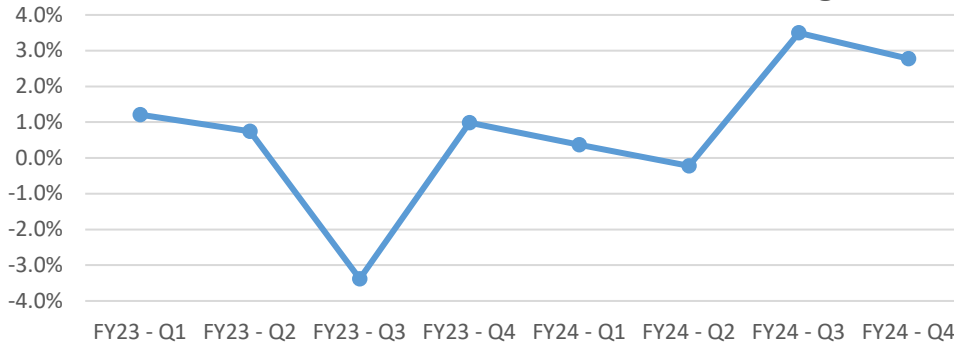

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Chart 6. Establishment Year Over Year % Change

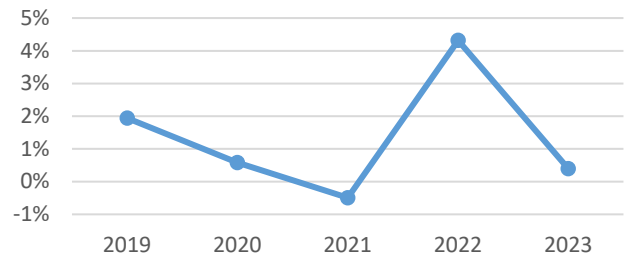

An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) measures the value of all goods and services produced within a specific area. Changes in GDP from one period to another are important indicators of how the economy is performing. Chart 7 illustrates the YOY percentage change in real GDP for calendar years. Table 2 below details the percentage contribution of each industry to the total GDP for a specific county and how each industry's GDP changed compared to the previous calendar year.

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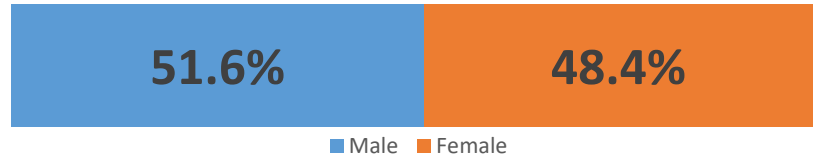

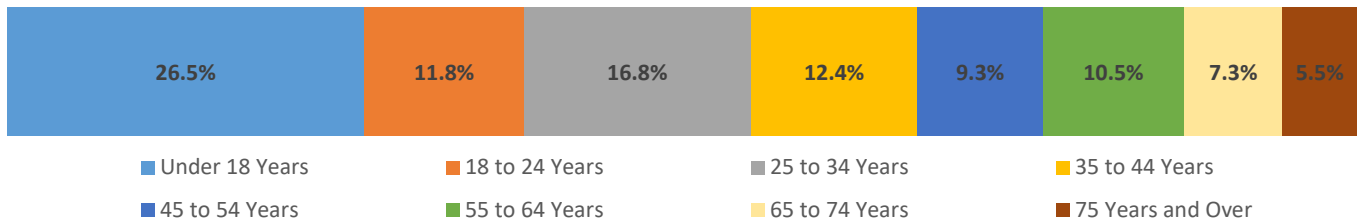

Population Sex



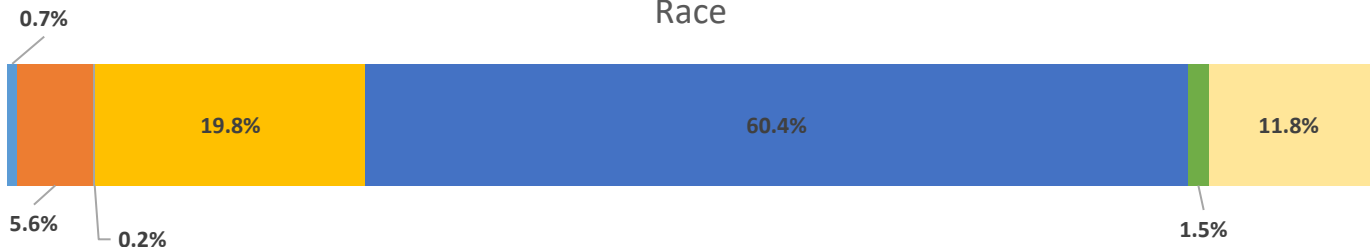

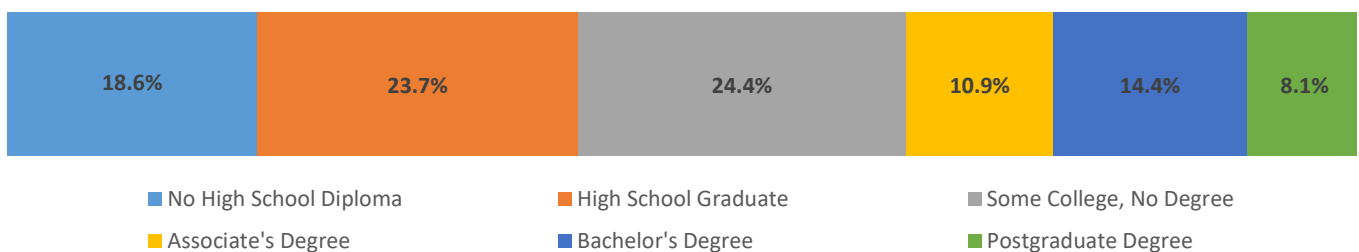
