
## Quarterly Economic Summary De Baca County



In the first quarter of FY25, 20 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q1 FY24, with a statewide 1.8% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was observed across most industry sectors, with the construction industry leading the way. Employment, wages, and the number of establishments have also increased YOY at the state level.

De Baca County's MTGR increased by nearly \$1.1M, or 11.6%, from Q4 FY24 to Q1 FY25, as seen in Chart 1. Chart 2 indicates that the largest industry as a percentage of MTGR was construction, accounting for 35% of total MTGR in Q1 FY25, similar to 32% in the previous quarter. Table 1 on the following page shows that De Baca County experienced a 41% decline in MTGR, with only 4 industries posting growth.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) provide the most accurate tax data for assessing underlying economic activity. The data collection process involves matching tax payments with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.





The largest decrease came from the construction industry, which posted a \$5.9M YOY decline, driving the overall \$7.3M decrease in MTGR.

Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections during Q1 FY25 (\$149K), as seen in Chart 4, show an increase of \$54.8K, or 58%, compared to Q4 FY24. The amount collected during Q1 FY25 is also \$16.4K larger than the eight-quarter average of \$132.7K. Total employment and average weekly wages in Q4 FY24 decreased YOY by 7% and 7.5%, respectively (Chart 5). Chart 6 on the next pages shows that the YOY change in the number of establishments remained negative in Q4 FY24.








An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) measures the value of all goods and services produced within a specific area. Changes in GDP from one period to another are important indicators of how the economy is performing. Chart 7 illustrates the YOY percentage change in real GDP for calendar years. Table 2 below details the percentage contribution of each industry to the total GDP for a specific county and how each industry's GDP changed compared to the previous calendar year.
