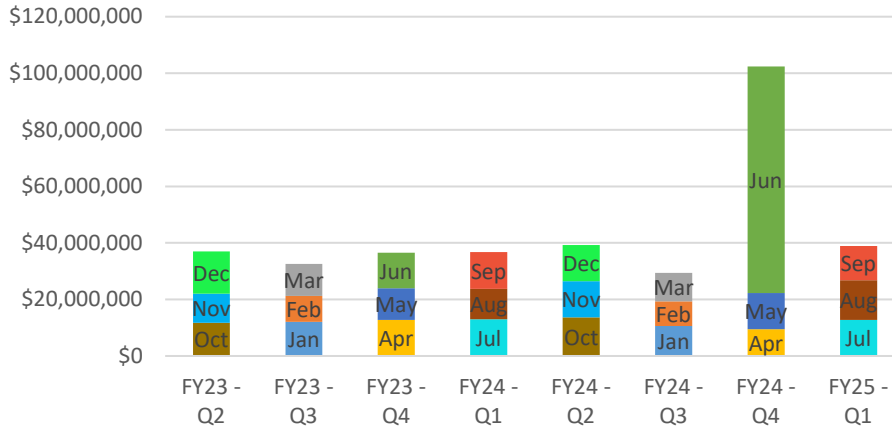

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Chart 1. Matched Taxable Gross Receipts Per Quarter

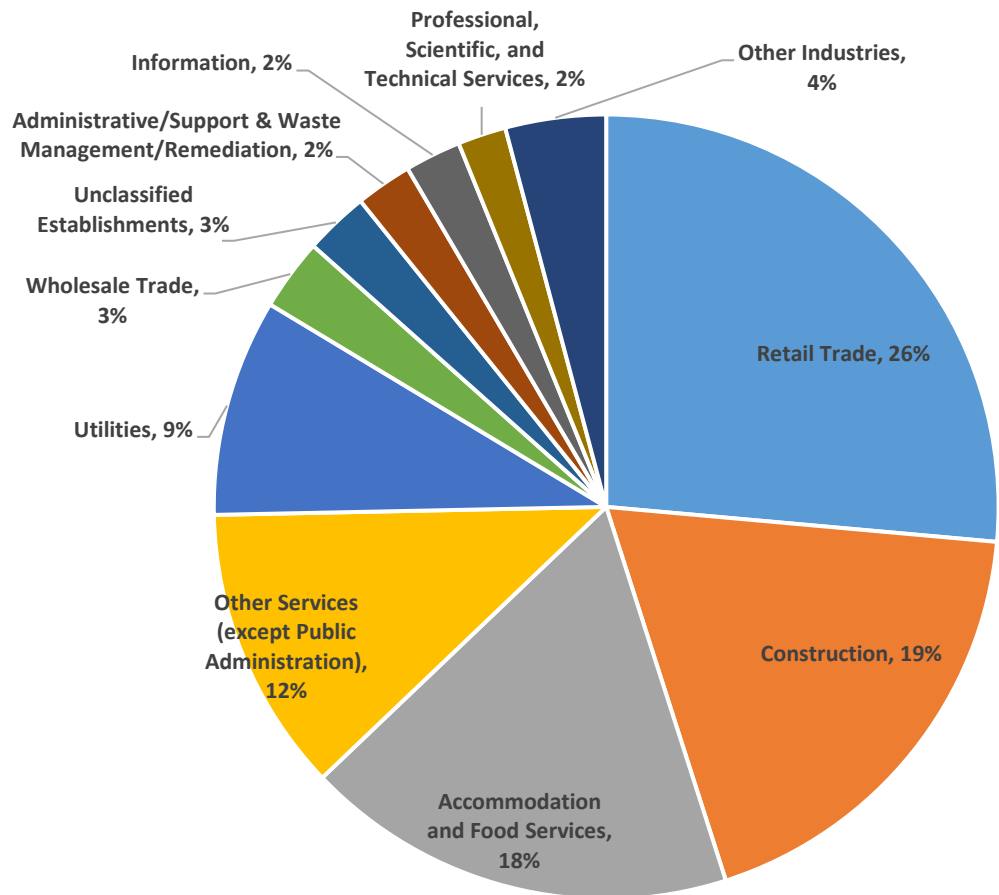

In the first quarter of FY25, 20 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q1 FY24, with a statewide 1.8% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was observed across most industry sectors, with the construction industry leading the way. Employment, wages, and the number of establishments have also increased YOY at the state level.

Guadalupe County's MTGR in Q1 FY25 totaled \$38.9M, slightly higher than the six-quarter average of \$35.2M recorded from Q2 FY23 to Q3 FY24 (Chart 1). As shown in Chart 2, retail trade accounted for the largest share of MTGR at 26%, followed by construction. In the previous quarter, administrative/support & waste management/remediation had been the largest industry, comprising 68% of MTGR.

**Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR)** provide the most accurate tax data for assessing underlying economic activity. The data collection process involves matching tax payments with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.

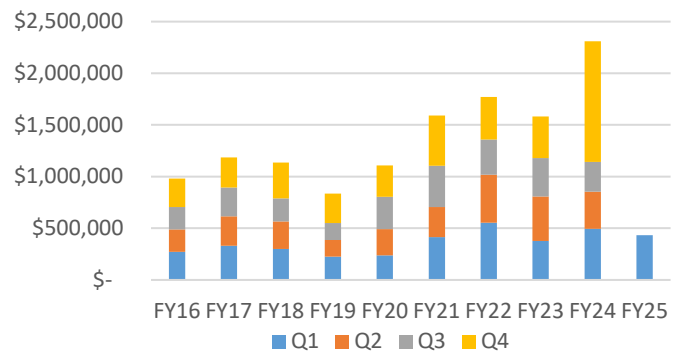

Table 1 shows that 10 industries reported a YOY increase in MTGR. The largest gain came from the other services industry, which posted a \$2.1M increase, while construction recorded the largest decline, dropping by nearly \$1.1M YOY.

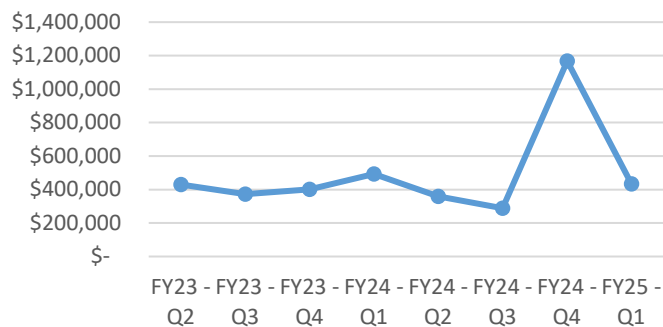
Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections in Q1 FY25 totaled \$434K, representing a 62.8% decrease from Q4 FY24, as shown in Chart 4. Meanwhile, total employment and average weekly wages increased by 6.1% and 5%, respectively, YOY (Chart 5). Chart 6 on the next page indicates that the number of establishments grew by 4.8% YOY in Q4 FY24.

**Chart 3. Annual Total GRT Revenue Collections**



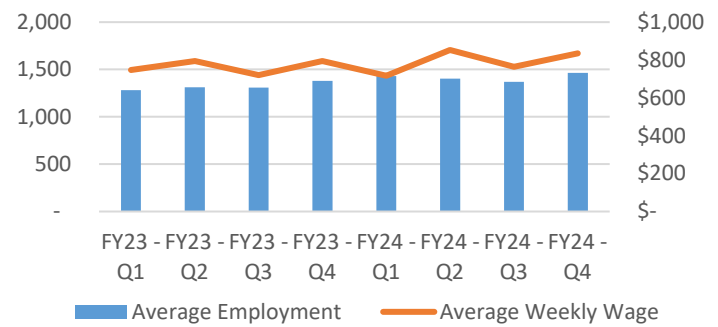

**Chart 5. Total Employment & Weekly Wage**



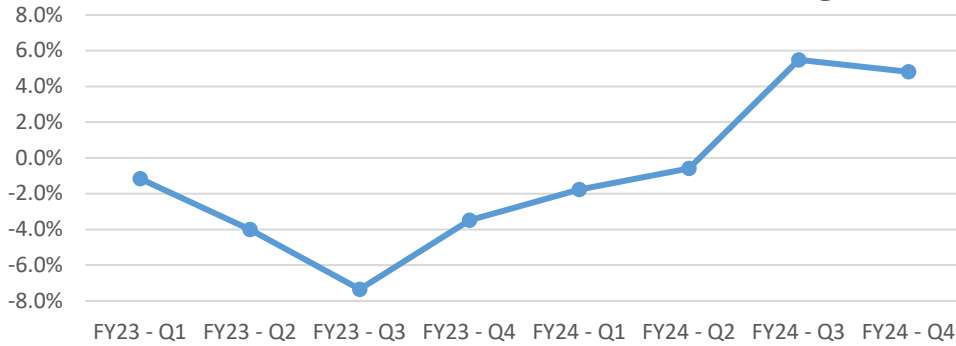

Chart 6. Establishment Year Over Year % Change

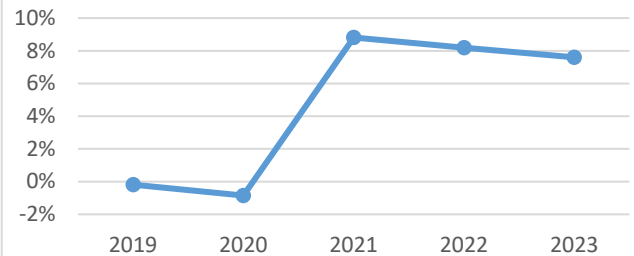

An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

**Gross Domestic Product (GDP)** measures the value of all goods and services produced within a specific area. Changes in GDP from one period to another are important indicators of how the economy is performing. Chart 7 illustrates the YOY percentage change in real GDP for calendar years. Table 2 below details the percentage contribution of each industry to the total GDP for a specific county and how each industry's GDP changed compared to the previous calendar year.
