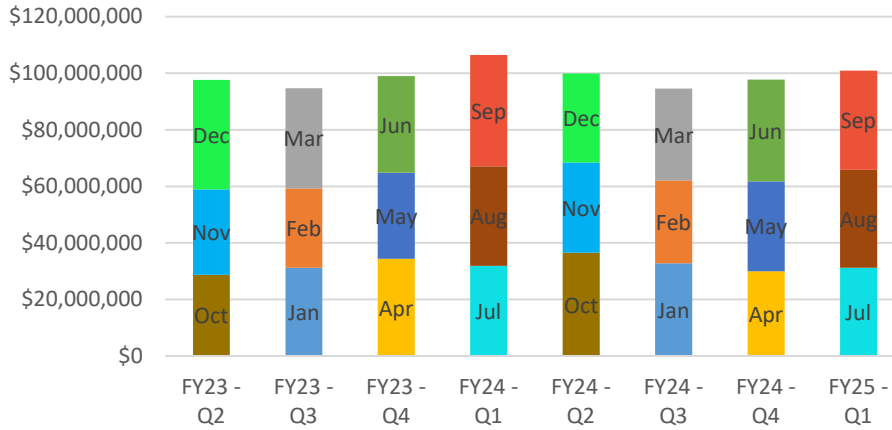

Chart 1. Matched Taxable Gross Receipts Per Quarter

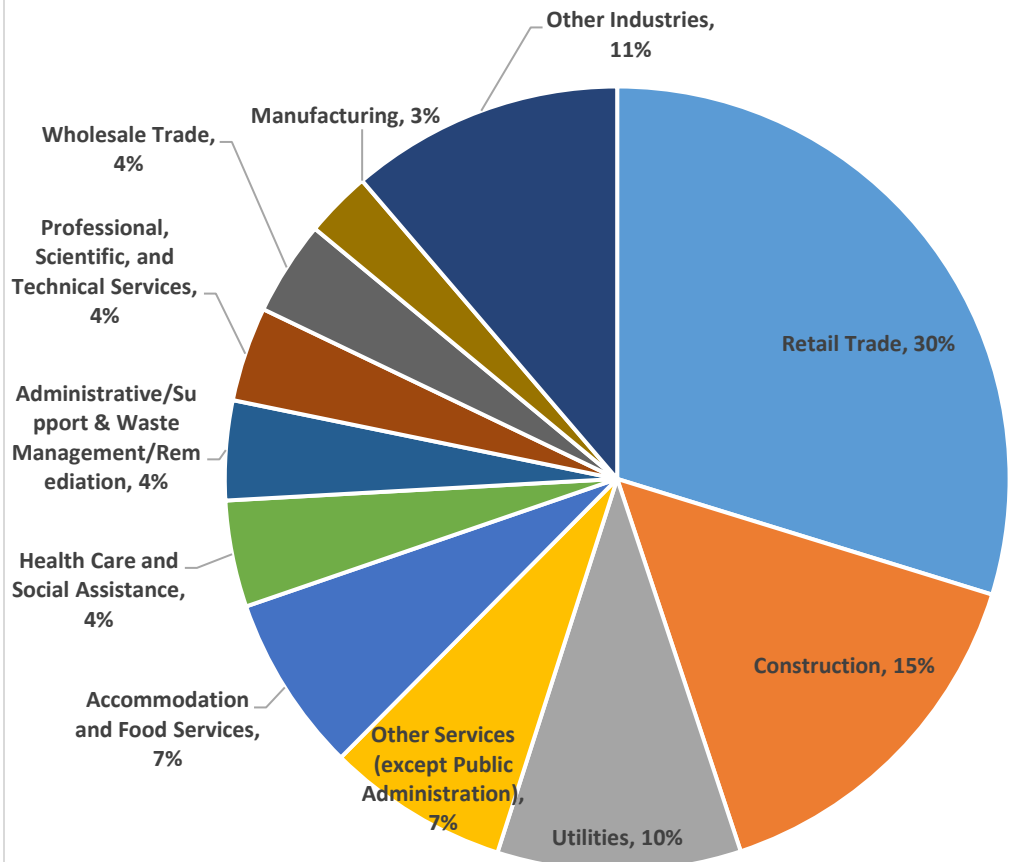

In the first quarter of FY25, 20 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q1 FY24, with a statewide 1.8% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was observed across most industry sectors, with the construction industry leading the way. Employment, wages, and the number of establishments have also increased YOY at the state level.

Chart 1 shows that Roosevelt County's MTGR in Q1 FY25 totaled nearly \$101M, which is \$3.2M higher than Q4 FY24 and \$2.1M above the eight-quarter average. MTGR has shown a stable trend over the last eight quarters. The largest industry by percentage of MTGR was retail trade, accounting for 30% of total MTGR (Chart 2). Retail trade was also the largest industry in the previous quarter, maintaining the same percentage.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) provide the most accurate tax data for assessing underlying economic activity. The data collection process involves matching tax payments with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.

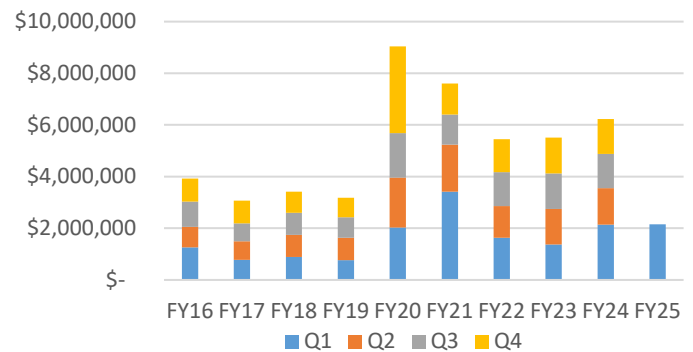

Table 1 shows that, when comparing YOY MTGR changes, the largest growth came from the professional, scientific, and technical services industry, posting a YOY increase of \$930K. Retail trade experienced the largest decline, decreasing by \$2.4M.

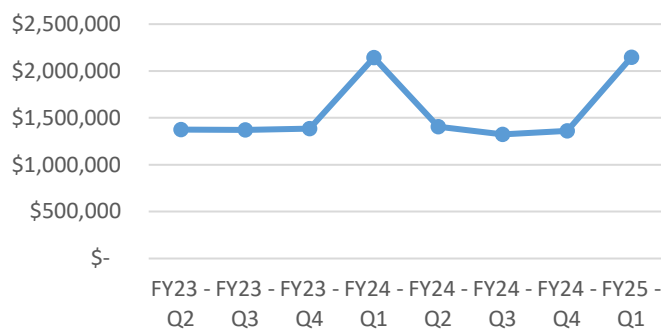
Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collected during Q1 FY25 (\$2.1M) was 57.9% more than the amount collected during Q4 FY24 (\$1.4M), as seen in Chart 4. Over the last eight quarters, GRT collections averaged \$1.6M. While average employment in Q4 FY24 decreased by 1.3%, or 79, YOY, average weekly wages posted an increase of \$27, or 3.2%, YOY (Chart 5).

Chart 3. Annual Total GRT Revenue Collections



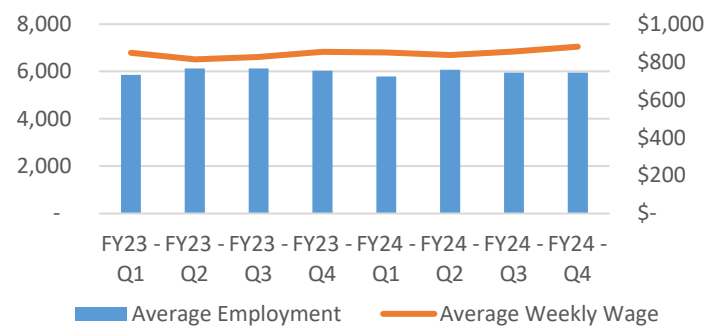

Chart 5. Total Employment & Weekly Wage



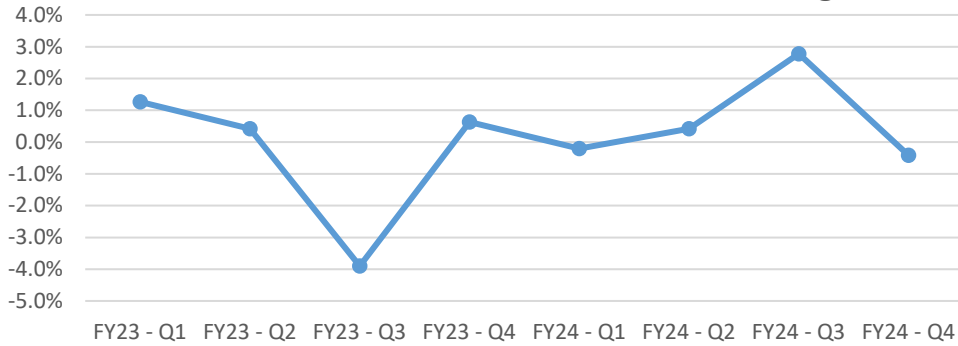

Chart 6. Establishment Year Over Year % Change

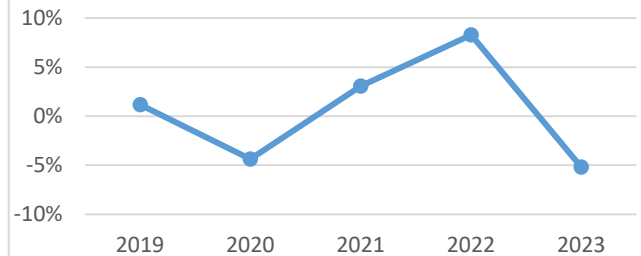

An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) measures the value of all goods and services produced within a specific area. Changes in GDP from one period to another are important indicators of how the economy is performing. Chart 7 illustrates the YOY percentage change in real GDP for calendar years. Table 2 below details the percentage contribution of each industry to the total GDP for a specific county and how each industry's GDP changed compared to the previous calendar year.
