

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In the first quarter of FY25, 20 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q1 FY24, with a statewide 1.8% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was observed across most industry sectors, with the construction industry leading the way. Employment, wages, and the number of establishments have also increased YOY at the state level.

Santa Fe County's MTGR in Q1 FY25 totaled \$1.78B, slightly growing by 0.8%, or \$14.9M, from Q4 FY24, as seen in Chart 1. Retail trade, construction, accommodation and services continued to be the top three industries. accounting for 54% of MTGR (Chart 2), consistent with the previous quarter. indicated in Table 1 on the next page, the county experienced a YOY growth in MTGR by 4%.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) provide the most accurate tax data for assessing underlying economic activity. The data collection process involves matching tax payments with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.









The largest contribution to the growth came from the wholesale trade industry, which posted a \$17.2M growth YOY. The professional, scientific, and technical services industry experienced the largest decline of \$8.2M. Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collected during Q1 FY25 (\$28.5M) was 8.1% more than the amount collected during Q4 FY24 (\$26.3M), as seen in Chart 4. Total employment and average weekly wages both increased YOY by 0.9% and 3.9%, respectively (Chart 5). Chart 6 on the next page shows that establishments increased by 2.4% YOY in Q4 FY24, with the number of establishments reaching 6.8K.











An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) measures the value of all goods and services produced within a specific area. Changes in GDP from one period to another are important indicators of how the economy is performing. Chart 7 illustrates the YOY percentage change in real GDP for calendar years. Table 2 below details the percentage contribution of each industry to the total GDP for a specific county and how each industry's GDP changed compared to the previous calendar year.


