

In the second quarter of FY25, 22 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q2 FY24, with a statewide 5.3% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was observed across most industry sectors, with professional, scientific, and technical services and other services leading the way. Employment, wages, and the number of establishments also increased YOY in New Mexico.

While Eddy County's MTGR decreased by \$68.8M, or 1.8%, from Q1 FY25 to Q2 FY25, the amount reported during Q2 FY25 (\$3.69B) was still \$207.3M higher than the eight-quarter average (\$3.49B), as seen in Chart 1. Chart 2 shows that mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction was the largest industry by MTGR at 40%, a slight increase from 38% in the prior quarter. Retail trade and construction followed, each accounting for about 10%.

Table 1 shows that all but 7 industries reported a YOY increase in MTGR. The largest increase came from mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction, with a YOY gain of \$143.7M. The largest decline came from wholesale trade, with a YOY decrease of \$21.6M.


Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections during Q2 FY25 (\$26.6M), as seen in Chart 4, show a decrease of about \$295K, or 1.1%, compared to Q1 FY25. In Q1 FY25, both employment and average weekly wages grew by 3% YOY (Chart 5). The number of establishments also grew by 2.2% YOY (Chart 6 on page 3).











An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.
