
## Quarterly Economic Summary Guadalupe County



In the second quarter of FY25, 22 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q2 FY24, with a statewide 5.3% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was observed across most industry sectors, with professional, scientific, and technical services and other services leading the way. Employment, wages, and the number of establishments also increased YOY in New Mexico.

Guadalupe County's MTGR decreased by \$3.5M, or 9.1%, from Q1 FY25 to Q2 FY25, as seen in Chart 1. The amount reported in Q2 FY25 was \$35.3M, which is \$3.9M lower than Q2 FY24's MTGR of \$39.3M. Chart 2 shows that the retail trade. construction, accommodation and food services industries were the top three by percentage of collectively MTGR. accounting for 63%. This share remained unchanged from the previous quarter.








Table 1 shows that Guadalupe County experienced an overall 10% decline in MTGR YOY. The largest decline came from construction, with a YOY decrease of \$3.4M. Professional, scientific, and technical services saw the largest growth, increasing by \$597K.

Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections during Q2 FY25 (\$381K) show a decrease of nearly \$53K, or 12.2%, compared to Q1 FY25 (Chart 4). In Q1 FY25, while employment declined by 1.7% YOY, average weekly wages grew by 6.6% (Chart 5). Establishments also grew by 6.6%, driven by growth in public administration (Chart 6 and Table 2 on page 3).



An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.
