
Quarterly Economic Summary Union County Released: April 2025





In the second quarter of FY25, 22 out of 33 counties reported positive yearover-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q2 FY24, with a statewide 5.3% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was observed across most industry sectors, with professional, scientific, and technical services and other services leading the way. Employment, wages, and the number of establishments also increased YOY in New Mexico.

Union County's MTGR decreased by \$5.7M (13.9%) from Q1 FY25 to Q2 FY25, as shown in Chart 1. However, Q2 FY25's MTGR (\$35.5M) remained \$2.1M above the eight-quarter average (\$33.3M). Chart 2 shows that the construction and retail trade industries led Union County's economy, each comprising 21% of MTGR. In the previoius quarter, construction accounted for 28% of MTGR, followed by utilities at 19% and retail trade at 15%.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) provide the most accurate tax data for assessing underlying economic activity. The data collection process involves matching tax payments with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.






Table 1 shows that Union County reported a 6% YOY decrease in MTGR. While retail trade saw the largest growth, increasing by \$1.1M YOY, health care and social assistance experienced the largest decline, with a YOY decrease of \$5.6M.

Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections during Q2 FY25 (\$281K), as seen in Chart 4, show a decrease of \$159K, or 36.1%, compared to Q1 FY25. In Q1 FY25, while employment declined YOY by 3%, average weekly wages grew by 15.2% YOY (Chart 5). The number of establishments also grew by 0.6% YOY (Chart 6 on page 3).





An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The **Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW)**, used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.


