



In the third quarter of FY25, 26 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q3 FY24, with a statewide 5.9% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was observed across most industry sectors, with construction and unclassified establishments leading the way. Employment, wages, and the number of establishments also increased YOY in New Mexico in Q2 FY25.

Roosevelt County's MTGR grew by \$22.4M, or 22.2%, from Q2 FY25 to Q3 of FY25 as seen in Chart 1. Chart2 shows that retail trade was the largest industry by percentage MTGR, followed by other services, utilities, and construction, each accounting for around 10% (Chart 2). Table 1 on the next page shows a YOY increase in MTGR of 30%, or \$28.8M. Q3 FY25 in compared to Q3 FY24. The largest contributor to this growth was other services.








Gross receipts tax (GRT) revenue collections increased by \$318K, or 22.6%, from Q2 FY25 to Q3 of FY25, as seen in Chart 4. Over the last eight quarters, GRT collections have averaged \$1.6M.

While average employment in Roosevelt County decreased by 1.1% in Q2 FY25 compared to the same quarter last year, average weekly wages showed an increase of \$38, a percent increase of 4.5% (Chart 5). As seen in Chart 6 on the next page, the number of establishments has continued to decrease YOY since Q4 FY24. In Q2 FY25, establishments declined by 0.2% compared to Q2 FY 24.



An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.
