
## Quarterly Economic Summary Torrance County



In the third quarter of FY25, 26 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q3 FY24, with a statewide 5.9% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Statewide growth was observed across most industry sectors, with construction and unclassified establishments leading the way. Employment, wages, and the number of establishments also increased YOY in New Mexico in Q2 FY25.

Torrance County's MTGR increased by \$65.1M, or 41.3%, from Q2 FY25 to Q3 FY25, as seen in Chart 1. The amount reported in Q3 FY25 (\$223M) was the highest in the past eight quarters, led by the \$119M MTGR in February. As seen in Chart 2, the largest industry as a percentage of MTGR was the construction industry, which accounted for 65% of the total MTGR during Q3 FY25. Last quarter, construction accounted for 45%, followed by retail trade at 17%.








Table 1 shows that all but 9 industries reported a YOY increase in MTGR. The largest increase came from the construction industry, which posted a YOY increase of nearly \$105M. The largest decline came from the professional, scientific, and technical services industry, which posted a YOY decrease of \$2M.

Chart 3 shows that total gross receipts tax (GRT) revenue collections through Q3 in FY25 have already outpaced the annual GRT revenue collections of previous fiscal years. While average employment in Q2 FY25 slightly increased by 1.2% YOY, average weekly wages remained the same (Chart 5).



An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.
