
Quarterly Economic Summary Quay County



In the fourth quarter of FY25, 24 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q4 FY24, with a statewide 6.9% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Growth was observed across most industry sectors, led by construction and mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction. In Q3 FY25, employment and average wages in New Mexico increased YOY, while the number of establishments declined.

Quay County's increased by nearly \$9.9M, or 17.9%, from Q3 to Q4 FY25, as seen in Chart 1. MTGR followed a similar seasonal pattern in both FY24 and FY25, with midyear declines followed by a rebound in Q4. Chart 2 shows that the largest industry as a percentage of MTGR was retail trade, followed by accommodation and food services, similar to Q3 FY25. when they accounted for 32% and 12%, respectively.


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




Table 1 shows that, when comparing YOY MTGR changes, Quay County experienced a growth of 4%, or \$2.4M. Despite the \$1.4M decline in the accommodation and food services industry, the retail trade industry showed an increase of \$1.9M, leading to the net overall increase.

Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collected during Q4 FY25 (\$1M) was 22.4% more than the amount collected during Q3 FY25 (\$850.3K), as seen in Chart 4. Chart 6 on the next page shows that the YOY change in establishments has remained positive, increasing by 1.5% in Q3 FY25 compared to Q3 FY24.



An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.
