
Quarterly Economic Summary Roosevelt County



In the fourth quarter of FY25, 24 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q4 FY24, with a statewide 6.9% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Growth was observed across most industry sectors, led by construction and mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction. In Q3 FY25, employment and average wages in New Mexico increased YOY, while the number of establishments declined.

Roosevelt County's MTGR declined by \$10.1M, or 8.2%, from Q3 FY25 to Q4 of FY25. Retail trade, construction, and other services were the top 3 industries by MTGR in Q4 FY25, as seen in Chart 2. Table 1 on the next page shows an overall increase in MTGR of 16%, or \$113.3M, in Q4 compared to Q4 FY24. The largest contributor to this increase was construction industry, which posted a YOY growth of \$6M, or 53%.








Gross receipts tax (GRT) revenue collections decreased by \$152.4K, or 8.8%, from Q3 FY25 to Q4 of FY25, as seen in Chart 4. Over the last eight quarters, GRT collections have averaged \$1.6M.

Total average employment in Roosevelt County decreased by 98 in Q3 FY25 compared to the same quarter last year, representing a decline of 1.6%. In contrast, average weekly wages rose during the same period, showing a YOY increase of \$34, or 4% (Chart 5). The number of establishments also fell, totaling 472 in Q3 FY25, which is 1.9% lower than the 482 reported in Q3 FY24 (Chart 6 on the next page).



An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.


