
### Quarterly Economic Summary

#### San Juan County



In the fourth quarter of FY25, 24 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q4 FY24, with a statewide 6.9% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Growth was observed across most industry sectors, led by construction and mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction. In Q3 FY25, employment and average wages in New Mexico increased YOY, while the number of establishments declined.

Over the last eight quarters, San Juan County's MTGR has averaged \$1.02B, which is \$86.9M less than the amount reported during Q4 FY25 (\$1.11B). From Q3 FY25 to Q4 FY25, MTGR increased by 3.8%, or just over \$40.2M. As seen in Chart 2, the retail trade and construction industries accounted 40% of total MTGR. These industries were also the top two in the previous quarter, comprising a total of 42%, followed by other services at 8%.


Table 1 shows that all but 8 industries reported YOY growth. Construction recorded the largest increase at \$34.4M, while manufacturing posted the largest decline at \$6.5M. Agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting shows negative MTGR in Q4 FY25, which could be due to amended tax filings with NM TRD.


Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections during Q4 FY25 (\$14.2M), as seen in Chart 4, show an increase of \$216K, or 1.5%, compared to Q3 FY25. While employment and average wages grew by 3.2% and 5.4% YOY in Q3 FY25 (Chart 5), establishments declined by 1.4% compared to Q3 FY24 (Chart 6).



An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.




