
### Quarterly Economic Summary

#### Socorro County



In the fourth quarter of FY25, 24 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q4 FY24, with a statewide 6.9% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Growth was observed across most industry sectors, led by construction and mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction. In Q3 FY25, employment and average wages in New Mexico increased YOY, while the number of establishments declined.

Socorro County's **MTGR** increased by nearly \$25.9M, or 35.3%, from Q3 FY25 to Q4 FY25, as seen in Chart 1. This aligns with the seasonal trend of declining MTGR from Q2 to Q3 and rising from Q3 to Q4. Chart 2 shows that retail trade was the largest contributor to MTGR, closely followed by construction. Last quarter, retail trade accounted for 30%, while utilities and accommodation and food services followed at 12% and 11%, respectively.








Table 1 shows that 13 industries reported a YOY increase in MTGR. The largest increase came from the professional, scientific, and technical services industry, which posted a YOY increase of \$5.5M. However, Socorro County recorded an overall net decrease in MTGR by 8%, or \$8.7M, with the largest decline coming from the construction industry.

The quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections during Q4 FY25 (\$1M), as seen in Chart 4, show an increase of 47.6%, or \$331.6K, compared to Q3 FY25. While employment and wages grew YOY in Q3 FY25, the number of establishments declined (Table 2).



An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.


The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.


