

Taos County



In the fourth quarter of FY25, 24 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q4 FY24, with a statewide 6.9% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Growth was observed across most industry sectors, led by construction and mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction. In Q3 FY25, employment and average wages in New Mexico increased YOY, while the number of establishments declined.

Taos County's decreased by \$10.8M, or 3.8%, from Q3 FY25 to Q4 FY25, as seen in Chart 1. The amount reported during Q4 FY25 (\$275.9M) was also \$16.6M lower than the eight-quarter average (\$292.6M). As seen in Chart retail trade construction were the top 2 industries, accounting for 50% of MTGR in Q4 FY25. Table 1 on the next page shows accommodation and food services led the overall YOY growth in MTGR.




Chart 3 shows that annual gross receipts tax (GRT) revenue collections have trended upward in Taos County. On a quarterly basis, however, GRT revenue collections decreased by \$183.7K, or 2.9%, from Q3 FY25 to Q4 of FY25 (Chart 4).

Total average employment in the county decreased by 1.4% in Q3 FY25 compared to the same quarter last year. Average weekly wages, on the other hand, posted a YOY increase of \$40, or 4.9%. As shown in Chart 6 (next page), the number of establishments declined by 3.9% YOY, from 1,446 in Q3 FY24 to 1,390 in Q3 FY25.

Collections



An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.
