
Quarterly Economic Summary Union County

Released: October 2025





In the fourth quarter of FY25, 24 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q4 FY24, with a statewide 6.9% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Growth was observed across most industry sectors, led by construction and mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction. In Q3 FY25, employment and average wages in New Mexico increased YOY, while the number of establishments declined.

Over the last eight quarters, Union County's MTGR has averaged \$35.2M, which is \$672K less than the amount reported during Q4 FY25 (\$35.9M). From Q3 FY25 to Q4 FY25, MTGR increased by 16.3%, or just over \$5M. As seen in Chart 2, the retail trade, construction, utilities industries accounted for 67% of total MTGR. These industries were also the top three contributors in Q3 FY25: construction (24%), utilities (21%), and retail trade (19%).

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) provide the most accurate tax data for assessing underlying economic activity. The data collection process involves matching tax payments with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.





Table 1 shows that, when comparing YOY MTGR changes, the largest contribution came from the retail trade industry, which posted a YOY increase of \$2.2M. Most of the industries experienced a decline, with the largest coming from professional, scientific, and technical services, which posted a YOY decrease of \$1M. Unclassified establishments shows negative MTGR in Q4 FY25. This could be due to amended tax filings with NM TRD.

Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collected during Q4 FY25 (\$306.4K) increased by 26.2% from Q3 FY25 (\$242.7K), as seen in Chart 4.






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An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.


