
Quarterly Economic Summary Valencia County



In the fourth quarter of FY25, 24 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q4 FY24, with a statewide 6.9% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Growth was observed across most industry sectors, led by construction and mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction. In Q3 FY25, employment and average wages in New Mexico increased YOY, while the number of establishments declined.

Valencia County's MTGR decreased by \$32.6M, or 6.2%, from Q3 FY25 to Q4 FY25, as seen in Chart 1. The amount reported during Q4 FY25 (\$493.7M) was still \$3M larger than the eightquarter average (\$490.6M). As seen in Chart 2, the largest industry as percentage of MTGR was construction, accounting for 30% of the total MTGR during Q4 FY25, followed by retail trade. These two industries were also the top contributors last quarter.








Table 1 shows that all but 7 industries reported a YOY increase in MTGR. The largest increase came from the retail trade industry, which posted a YOY increase of \$5.9M. The largest decline came from manufacturing, which posted a YOY decrease of \$14.7M.

Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections during Q4 FY25 (\$6.7M), as seen in Chart 4, show a decrease of \$365.7K or 5.2% compared to Q3 FY25. The amount collected during Q4 FY25 is also \$544.4K smaller than the eight-quarter average (\$7.3M). Employment, average wages, and the number of establishments all increased YOY in Q3 FY25 (Charts 5 and 6).



An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.


