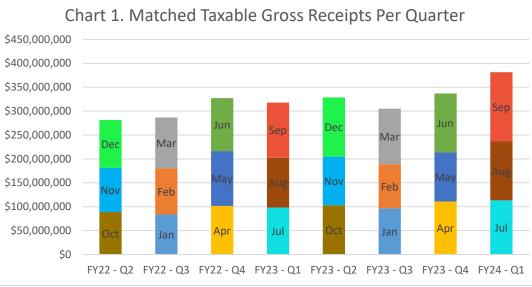

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In the first quarter of FY24, 28 of 33 counties saw year-over-year economic growth, with 9.1% growth statewide in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). State gross receipts increased from the fourth quarter of FY23, bringing it to the

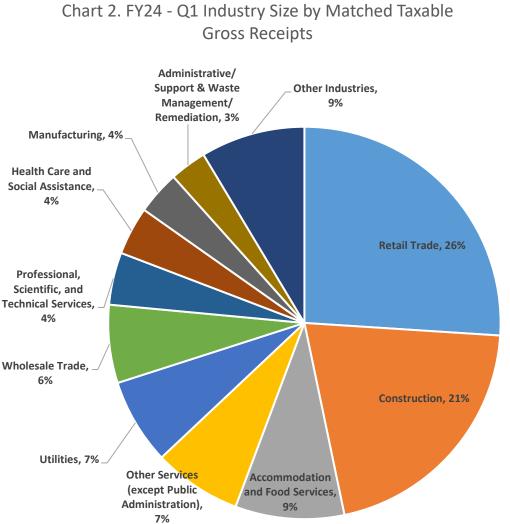
highest ever quarterly

total in MTGR for the

state.

Over the last eight quarters matched taxable gross (MTGR) receipts have averaged \$321.6M, which is less \$60.7M than the amount reported during Q1 FY24 (\$381.3M). From Q4 FY23 to Q1 FY24 MTGR increased by 13.2% or just over \$44.4M. With this increase MTGR in Curry County has an upward trend. As seen in Chart 2, trade the retail and construction industries accounted for 47% of Curry County's total MTGR.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) are the best tax data available to show underlying economic activity. The data collection process matches a tax payment with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.

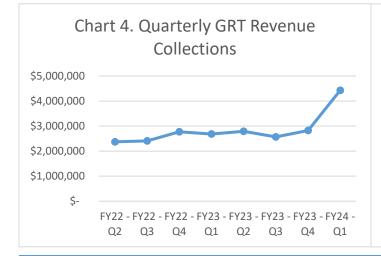

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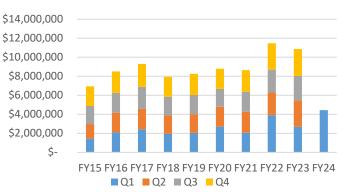

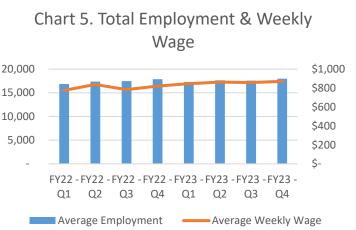
Table 1 shows that, when comparing year-over-year (YOY) MTGR growth, the largest contribution came from the construction industry, which reported a YOY increase of \$22.5M. The largest decline came from the utilities industry, which posted a YOY decrease of \$608K. The agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting industry, in Table 1, shows negative MTGR in Q1 FY23. This could be due to amended tax filings with TRD. The amount of quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collected during Q1 FY24 (\$4.4M) was 56.9% more than the amount collected during Q4 FY23 (\$2.8M), as seen in Chart 4.



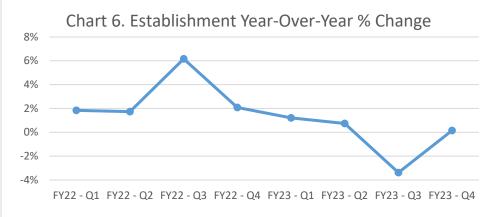

An **establishment**, as used in the QCEW and subsequently Chart 6 and Table 2, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, which produces goods or provides services at a single physical worksite and engaged, predominantly, in one type of economic activity.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the value of all goods and services produced in an area. The percentage that GDP grew (or shrank) from one period to another is an important indicator as to how the economy is performing. Table 2, below, shows the percentage of GDP each industry accounts for in the total GDP, in a specific county and the state. The chart also compares the county to the entire state of New Mexico, by showing the impact of specific industry sectors on the county's GDP compared to that of the whole state.

Chart 7. Calendar Year % Change In Real GDP Year-Over-Year

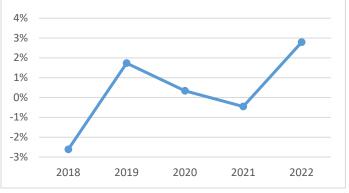

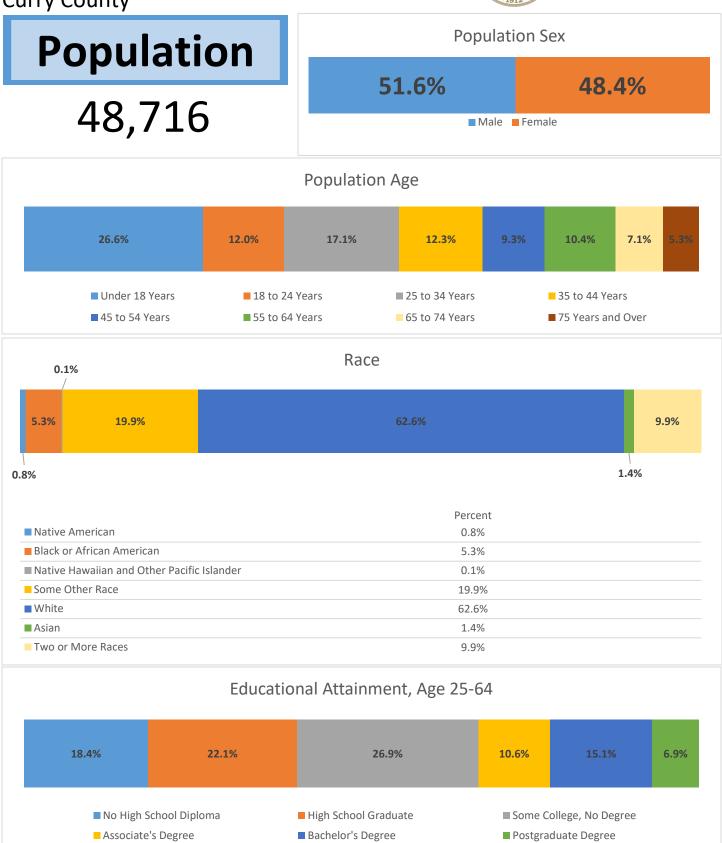
