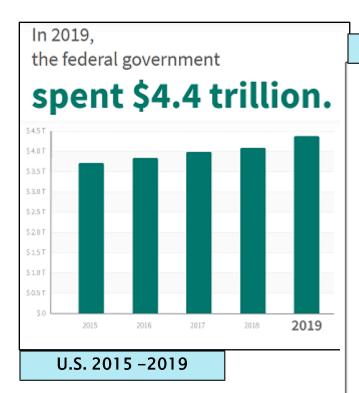

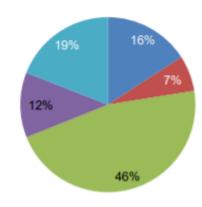


The Market is Huge

FY20 Recurring General Fund Appropriation: \$6.977 billion

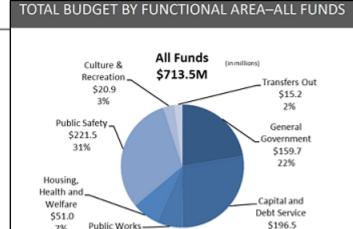

 - Have been in operation two or more years
 - Have a strong track record in the commercial sector
 - Have the personnel, resources and financial strength to bid on and perform under government contracts

- You must have a Government Marketing Strategy
 - Consider
 - Prime vs Subcontractor?
 - Teaming with other companies?
 - Start with Local, and work up to Federal?
 - Geographic constraints
 - Do the analysis and research for an effective strategy
 - Beta SAM provides Federal award data
 - State of NM Sunshine Portal
 - City and County procurement websites



Marketing Strategy

- More on your Government Marketing Strategy
 - Locate pre-solicitation information
 - Procurement Forecasts
 - Request for Information (RFI)
 - Sources Sought Notices (SSN)
 - Various solicitation approaches
 - Invitation to Bid (ITB)
 - Request For Proposals (RFP)
 - Request For Quotes (RFQ)
 - Sole source set-asides
 - ...we believe that people still buy from people, so don't wait for an RFP/RFQ to "drop" and then bid "blind" - get involved early in the acquisition cycle - investigate SSNs and RFI's

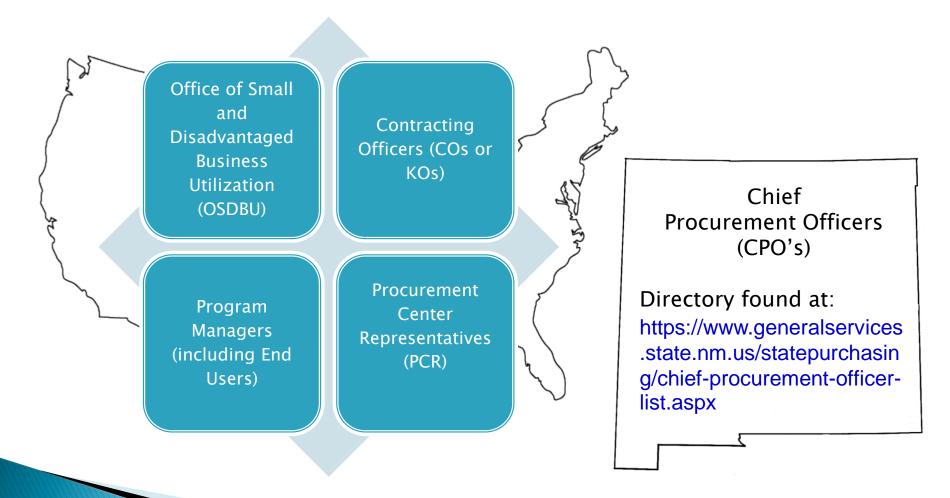

 - Social distancing may require you use a different address, phone number, email, etc.
 - You may be offering new products, temporarily retooling previous product lines, etc.
 - Be sure to add new NAICS/PSCs/NIGPs as appropriate

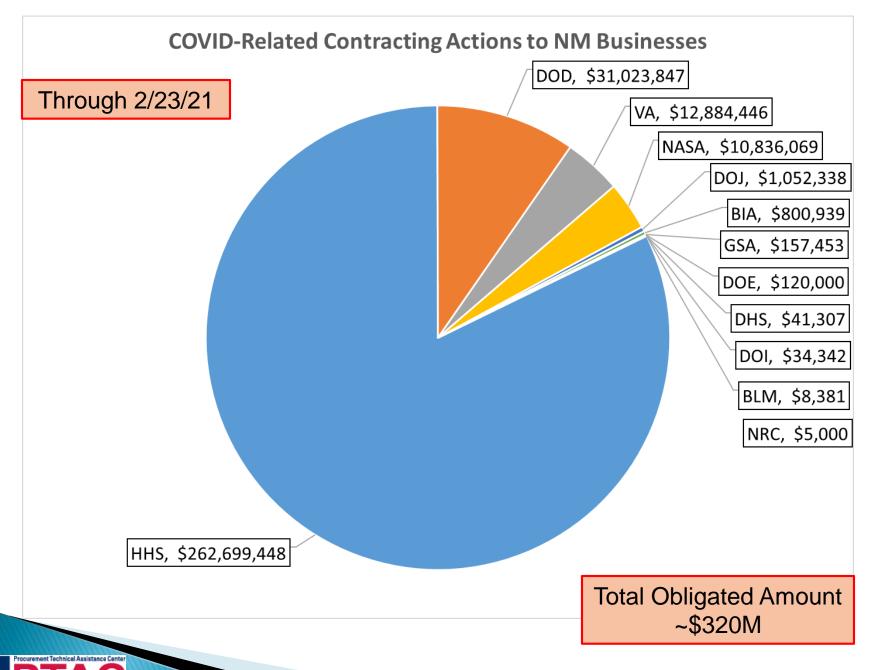

5 - Government Marketing

- Basic Requirements
 - Capabilities Statement your government brochure
 - Include qualifications, certifications, licenses, etc.
 - Focus on core competencies or products
 - Don't forget product and service codes (NAICS, NIGPs)
 - Keep it simple and clear
 - Business cards
 - Past Performance
 - Who, what, where, when
 - Problems solved / value added
 - Know who to market right material for the right person

Revisit your marketing strategy



Marketing Considerations

Things you should know

Technical Capability

- Do you have all of the industry strengths?
- Do you bring value-added differentiators?
- How does your quality compare to competitors?

Management

- Do you have a "mature" organization? For instance, do you have industry standard processes and procedures in place?
- Do you have knowledge of agency/office needs? Do your competitors?

Cost

- Are you a low cost provider? Does the industry appear to be looking for a lower cost provider?
- Is your pricing around the mean/average yet you offer technical or managerial differentiators?

- Special requirements and desire for novel solutions changes the landscape
- Update capabilities statement to reflect retooling or new product lines
- Past Performance
- Highlight desired characteristics
 - Responsiveness
 - Reliability
 - Product Quality

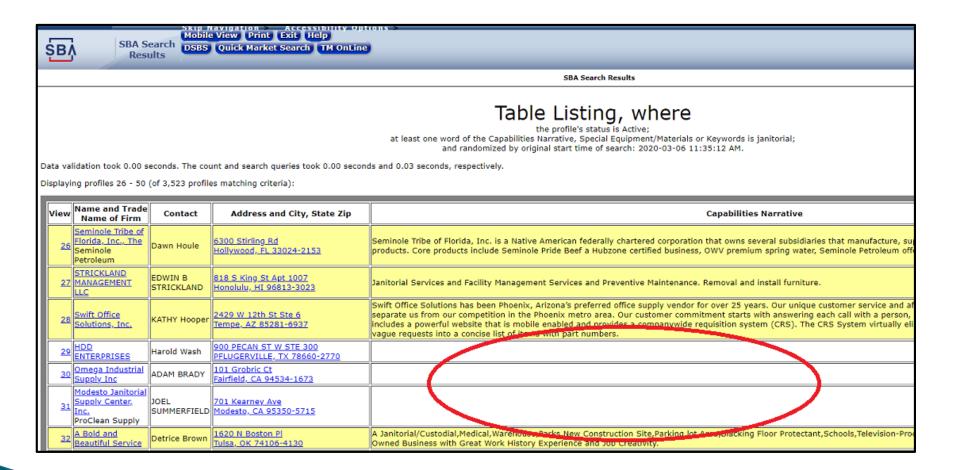
Dynamic Small Business Search (DSBS)

- SBA System
 - Integrated database of small businesses
 - Pulls most information from SAM
 - Requires some input from contractor
 - Used by Government contracting officers
 - Search by keywords or NAICS codes
 - Filter by socio-economic status, location
 - Used by contractors to find:
 - Teaming partners, competitors and potential customers

Example DSBS Search Results



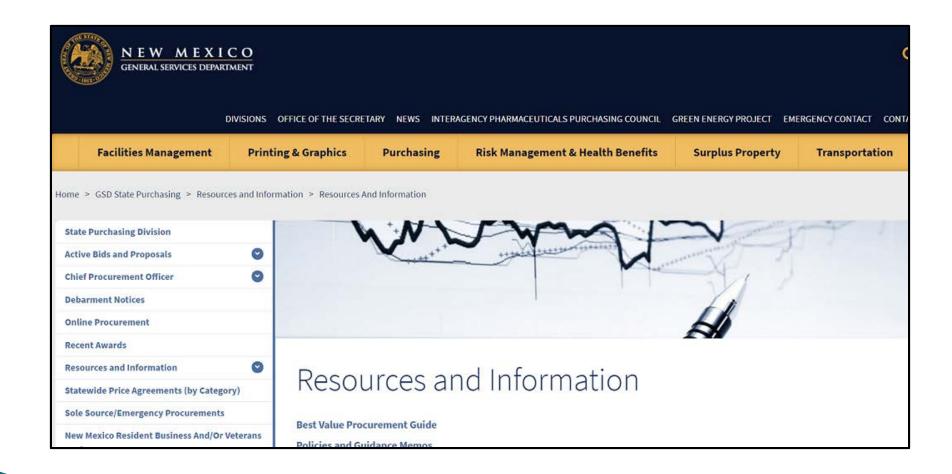


State of NM Registrations

- Register with State Purchasing Division
 - Receive electronic notifications of opportunities
 - View and download all pertinent information
 - Receive electronic notifications of solicitation changes
 - Allows you to respond electronically
 - Requires your Commodity Codes (NIGPs)
- Obtain Preference Certifications
 - In-state business or contractor preference (5%)
 - Veteran business or contractor preference (10%)
 - Find on Tax & Revenue website http://tax.newmexico.gov/

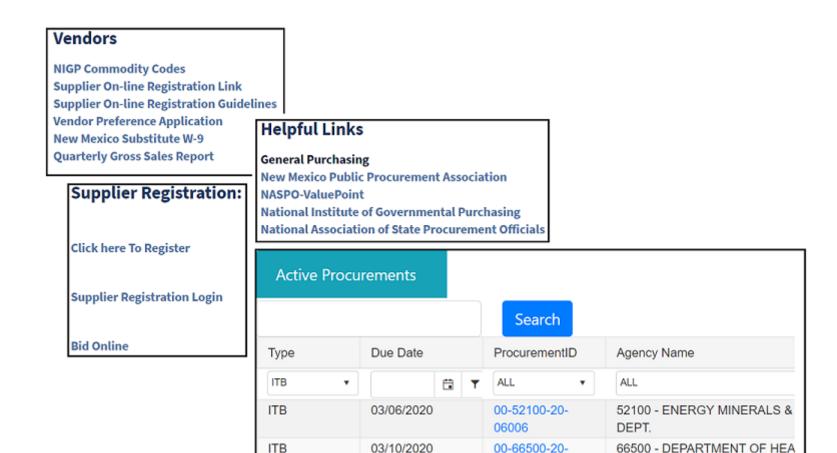

Doing Business with NM

- How the State buys:
 - Chief Procurement Officers (CPOs) ensure
 - "Best value" acquisitions
 - Fair and open competition
 - Transparency in all purchasing
 - Follow the New Mexico Procurement Code
 - Statewide Price Agreements

 - Emergency/Sole Source Purchases
 - State Use Act



- Ensure you are registered with appropriate agencies – they may be new to you
 - SAM for all Federal Opportunities
 - · May need NECO, FedConnect, Grants.gov, etc.
 - DLA specific DIBBS
 - GSA
 - State and Local
 - NM GSD, Counties and Cities
 - Hospitals and Schools

7 - Regulations

- Important regulatory requirements
 - Insurance Various types and amounts
 - Bonding Required for most construction contracts
 - Licenses/Certification Current and applicable
 - Security Clearances Significant with DoD, DOE
 - Health and Safety Plans
 - Environmental Compliance
 - Cyber Security
 - Many sources to consider
 - Federal Acquisitions Regulations (FAR) & Supplements
 - State Procurement Code
 - Local Ordinances



- Many agencies are changing regulatory requirements during the pandemic.
 - Numerous FAR Deviations
 - Progress Payments
 - Stop work orders/payments
 - CARES Act reimbursements
 - Undefinitized Contract Actions
 - Limitations on Subcontracting
 - Many others
 - Other regulatory requirements
 - Wearing face protection on DoD sites

8 - Pricing

Government contract pricing is about what is "Fair and Reasonable"; this means recovering your costs plus a fair profit.

- Pricing References
 - Commercial vs Government
 - General Services Administration (GSA)
 - Nationwide potential, fixed rates
 - Other contract vehicles
 - Industry reports

Include pricing strategy in your business plan



Pricing – FAR References

- Part 31 Contract Cost Principles and Procedures
 - (a) The pricing of contracts, subcontracts, and modifications to contracts and subcontracts whenever cost analysis is performed; and
 - (b) The determination, negotiation, or allowance of costs when required by a contract clause
 - Includes many types of contracts
- Part 12 applies to contracts for "Commercial Items"



- Fair and reasonable pricing is still required
- Understand pricing requirements relative to contract type
- Pay close attention to Wage Determinations
 - Depends on location of work
 - Work from home may be in a different county
- Taxes
 - NMGRT is still required
 - Payment of NMGRT has not been waived



9 – Accounting System

- Accounting practices and procedures must be in order
 - Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP)
 - Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB)
 - Acceptable accounting procedures & practices per the DCAA (Defense Contract Audit Agency)
 - DCAA website has checklists and tools
 - https://www.dcaa.mil/

Systems include

- Invoicing, Receipt, Acceptance and Property Transfer (iRAPT)
- Wide Area Workflow (WAWF) DoD Invoicing
- Invoice Processing Platform (IPP) DOI Invoicing
- Many other systems



Accounting System

- Your accounting system must be able to:
 - Segregate direct costs from indirect costs
 - Accumulate and segregate direct costs by contract and contract line item
 - Provide General Ledger control
 - Allow for accurate timekeeping
 - Segregate unallowable costs from allowable costs
 - Generate compliant invoices



- You must be able to segregate costs and labor
 - Establish unique numbers for COVID-related efforts
 - Includes necessary training
 - Retooling and retraining
 - Materials
 - Testing and certification
 - Account for idle time on Government contracts
 - Avoid duplicate payments for work not performed
 - Contract payment vs SBA payment (PPP, EIDL)



10 - Contract Types

- Types of Contracts
 - The way you are paid
 - Firm Fixed Price
 - Time and Materials
 - Cost Plus Fixed Fee / Award Fee / Incentive Fee
 - The structure of award
 - Purchase Order (usually for micro purchases)
 - A stand alone contract
 - Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ)
 - Flexible, task order-driven contract vehicle
 - Basic Ordering Agreement (BOA)
 - Blanket Purchase Agreement (BPA)
 - Government-Wide Acquisition Contract (GWAC)

What types make sense for your business?



- Expect to see new and different types of contracts
 - Other Transactional Authority (OTA)
 - Streamlined acquisition of prototypes/research
 - Letter contracts
 - Emergency and sole-source procurements
 - Very common to see:
 - FAR 8.405-6(a)(1)(A): An urgent and compelling need exists and following the ordering procedures would result in unacceptable delays
 - NMSA 1978, Section 13–1–127: The state purchasing agent, . . . may make or authorize others to make emergency procurements when there exists a threat to public health



Contract Ready Questions

- Can I afford to wait up to 90 days on payment?
- Am I compliant with regulations?
- Is my safety/quality rating high?
- Do I have the required licensed professionals and supervisors in place?
- Do I have a good performance record in this area?

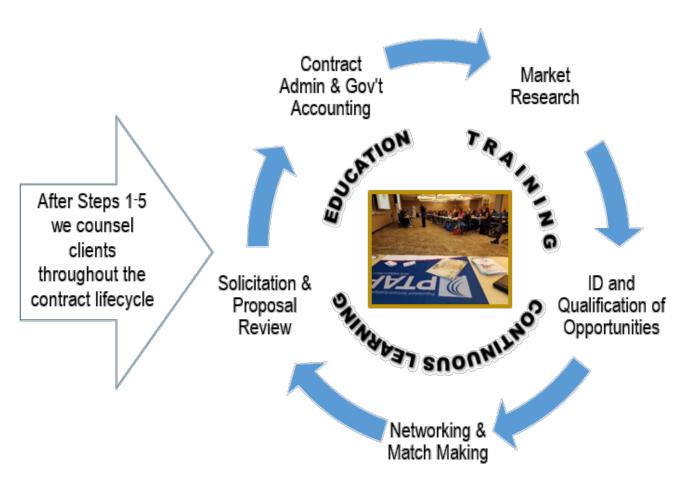
