## Intel Expansion in Rio Rancho Will Bring 700 High-Paying Jobs to New Mexico

Intel plans to invest \$3.5 billion in its New Mexico operations and hire more than 700 new workers to create a domestic hub for advanced semiconductor manufacturing at its fabrication facility in Rio Rancho, NM.

The project was announced at a press conference outside of the Rio Rancho facility on Monday, May 3 at 10 a.m.





Intel is expected to hire 1,000 construction workers starting this year and spend \$550 million on construction and new infrastructure.

"The time has come in New Mexico for better paying jobs and a faster growing economy," EDD Secretary Keyes said. "Intel's investment in the state signals again that New Mexico has a skilled workforce and a strong business climate, with the financial and logistical advantages to help businesses manage essential supply chains."

## **UPDATE:** <u>Small Business Recovery</u> <u>Loan Fund Expanded</u>

The fund offers loans up to \$150,000 at a rate of 1.625% for up to ten years with no payments due the first year, interest-only payments due in the second and third year, and no penalty for paying off a loan in advance. **Applications are scheduled to open on May 4.** 

### **UPDATE:** <u>Restaurant Revitalization</u> <u>Fund</u>

## **NEW!** <u>Supplemental Targeted EIDL</u> <u>Advance</u>

The SBA modified the Targeted EIDL Advance application process to determine if businesses also qualify for an additional \$5,000. SBA will contact eligible businesses to apply and applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis. To qualify, a business must be in a low-income community, suffered greater than 50% loss, and have 10 or fewer employees.

## **NEW!** <u>Employer Tax Credits for</u> <u>Employee Paid Leave</u>

Under the American Rescue Plan, employers are entitled to tax credits for providing paid leave to employees who take time off related to COVID-19.

### **NEW!** <u>Restoration and Resilience</u> <u>COVID Recovery Fund</u>

NEEF will provide funding to help restore public lands by distributing resources and mobilizing volunteers. Open to nonprofits, state and federal government agencies, federally recognized Tribes and local governments, and educational institutions. **Deadline: June 1.** 

## **NEW! EXIM Extends COVID-19** <u>Temporary Relief Measures</u>

Exim (Export-Import Bank of the United States) has extended the application period for temporary relief measures through April 2022. Programs include a Working Capital Guarantee; Supply Chain Financing Guarantee; and the agency's support for transportation-related and other large-scale exports through its Bridge/Backstop Financing Program and PreShe/Her/Hers Start-up Saturday for New Outdoor Recreation Businesses May 22 at 9am <u>Register</u>

## **NEW! USDA Rural Business Development Grants**

Eligible applicants are organizations seeking to provide rural communities with training and technical assistance to improve transportation services and facilities. Funding is not provided directly to individuals. Applications will be selected on a competitive basis. **Deadline: June 30.** 

## **NEW! Tribal Resource:** National RTAP Community Rides Grants

Offers current recipients and subrecipients of the Federal Transit Administration (FTA)'s Formula Grants for Rural Areas (Section 5311) program the opportunity to apply for grant awards of up to \$100,000 for projects that develop or strengthen transportation partnerships that improve social determinants of health in rural and tribal communities. **Deadline: May 10.** 

## **NEW!** <u>Women in Apprenticeships and Nontraditional Occupations</u> (WANTO) Technical Assistance Grant

This program aims to provide technical assistance to employers and labor unions to encourage employment of women in both apprenticeable and nontraditional occupations. Grant recipients must be community-based organizations. **Deadline: June 4.** 

## **NEW!** Wallace Global Fund

The Wallace Global Fund promotes an informed and engaged citizenry to fight injustice and protect the diversity of nature and the natural systems. Grants are provided for initiatives at the national and global levels, as well as for significant local or regional programs offering the potential to leverage broader impact. The focus is on nonprofit organizations and non-governmental organizations that are catalyzing significant change.

### **NEW!** <u>Saucony Run for Good Foundation</u>

The Saucony Run for Good Foundation is committed to improving the lives of children by helping to prevent and reduce childhood obesity. Grants of up to \$10,000 are provided to nonprofit community organizations that initiate and support youth running programs. Priority will be given to programs that serve youth populations not traditionally exposed to running programs. **Deadline: June 15.** 

#### **NEW!** ConocoPhillips SPIRIT of Conservation

The ConocoPhillips SPIRIT of Conservation program provides grants to improve habitat quality and quantity for both migratory and non-migratory bird populations. The program will award grants to protect, restore, or enhance grassland, wetland, sage-steppe, and coastal habitats for birds; and to conduct avian research or monitoring. Grants will range from \$50,000 to \$250,000. Nonprofit organizations, educational institutions, government agencies, and Tribes may apply. **Pre-proposal deadline: May 27.** 

#### NEW! Tribal Resource: Center for Indigenous Innovation and Health Equity

The CIIHE will support efforts including research, education, service, and policy development related to advancing sustainable solutions to address indigenous health disparities and advance health equity in the American Indian, Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander populations.

#### NMED Clean Diesel Program Grant Funding Opportunity

Offers competitive funding for projects that reduce harmful diesel emissions Eligible vehicles include school buses, municipal fleets, commercial transportation vehicles, and non-road equipment. **Deadline: June 11.** 

#### **CDFA Community Technical Assistance Program**

CDFA will provide technical assistance to communities from a dedicated team of development finance experts. Communities must have a population of no more than 20,000 and have a Major Disaster Declaration from FEMA for hurricanes or wildfires in 2018 or floods or tornadoes in 2019.

#### Harbor Freight Tools for Schools Prize for Teaching Excellence

Recognizes outstanding skilled trades teachers and programs in public high schools. Trades teachers or teams of up to three teachers may apply. First place awards of \$100,000, with \$70,000 for skilled trades program and \$30,000 for the teachers or teacher teams; Second place awards of \$50,000, with \$35,000 for skilled trades program and \$15,000 for the teachers or teacher teams. **Round 1 deadline: May 21; Round 2 deadline: August 4.**
