NMEDD Receives 2019 CiCi Award for Promoting Industry Development

New Mexico Economic Development Department (NMEDD) has been awarded a 2019 CiCi (Corporate Investment and Community Impact) Award from Due North Consulting, Inc., publishers of Trade & Industry Development Magazine.

This annual awards program recognizes corporate locations and investments with a focus on both the company investing in the community and the economic developers responsible for securing that investment.



NMEDD won this award for its work in securing a partnership with Netflix. According to their website, "Netflix's new U.S. production hub in New Mexico is a \$1 billion, 1,000-job investment and involves the purchase of a world-class studio in Albuquerque, continuing the 120-year history of film-making in that state and helping to expand training for workers in the film industry."

NMEDD's Rural & Small Business Strategy Conference

EDD held its first Rural & Small Business Strategy Conference in over a decade. Convening on Sept 26 and 27, participants were treated to a number of presentations in hopes to both inform and kick off a broader conversation about strategies for building wealth in rural New Mexico.

Friday morning's breakfast featured the signing of the Economic Development Department/Small Business Alliance strategic alliance memorandum (SAM).

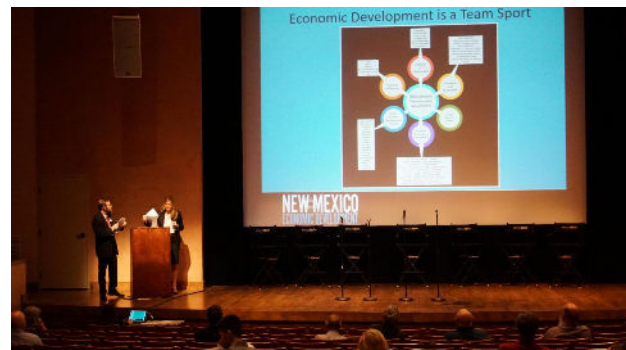

Axie Navas and Peter Mitchell traveled to Silver City for a conference on outdoor economics and then to Utah where Navas signed a multi-state accord, on behalf of Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, that affirms New Mexico's commitment to both recreation and conservation.

The Office of Outdoor Recreation has also launched a new Twitter feed #NMOOutdoor and is working on a revamped website and other social media engagement.

Navas and Mitchell have appointed a diverse advisory panel and are preparing for the upcoming 2020 Legislature.

Economic Division Director Meets with The Japan Times



Mark Roper, Director of the EDD Economic Development Division, recently met with the editorial staff of The Japan Times which is publishing a special section on America's Southwest with a focus on innovation.

The newspaper has 250,000 print subscribers and a monthly on-line reach of over 8 million. The Japan Times was especially impressed with Spaceport America and the fact that New Mexico is leading the way in many areas of

manufacturing innovation.

Frances Pacheco, project director for the publication, said Japanese manufacturers are looking to non-traditional areas of the United States to expand and especially like the Southwest because of the abundance of land.

Pacheco said Japanese culture still values the importance of personal relationships and face-to-face meetings.

EDD Presents Best Practice Award to NM Dept of Veteran's Services

The 24th Annual NMIFC (NM Infrastructure Conference) Best Practice Award in Economic Development was awarded by



the EDD to the NM Department of Veteran's Services for their work on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall project.

The purpose of the awards is to highlight a project where innovative solutions were implemented incorporating community-wide solutions and participation.

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial State Park was the first major Vietnam memorial in the U.S. It is currently the only state park dedicated exclusively to veterans of the Vietnam War. Located off U.S. Hwy 64 in Angel Fire, the Memorial was begun by Victor and Jeanne Westphall, the grief-stricken parents of Marine First Lieutenant David Westphall, who was among 16 young men in his unit killed in an

ambush on May 22, 1968 in Vietnam. The Westphalls used their son's insurance policies to begin construction of the Peace and Brotherhood Chapel, with support from the Disabled American Veterans. The Memorial was dedicated on May 22, 1971 and at the time of its construction the site received national media attention and helped inspire the establishment of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. In 1987. The U.S. Congress recognized the Disabled American Veterans Vietnam Veterans National Memorial as "a memorial of national significance".

Since the dedication, the memorial has hosted hundreds of thousands of visitors, and draws over 50,000 visitors annually. With the addition of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, a half scale replica of the Washington D.C. Vietnam Memorial Wall, with panels containing the 58,320 names of service members killed in action, including the 401 names of New Mexico citizens, it has the potential to increase the number of annual visitors significantly. At a cost of approximately \$300,000, the wall is being financed by the private fundraising efforts of Vietnam Veterans of America, Northern New Mexico Chapter 996.

This project will compliment a \$3,215,000 State Veterans Cemetery currently under construction and is also supported by \$900,000 capital outlay request by the Department of Veterans Services for lighted sidewalks with safety railing, signage and ADA compliant sidewalks to provide total access and enhanced experience to all visitors.

When completed, the complex will significantly increase Tourism to the area which is expected to impact outdoor recreation and other economic development outcomes.

Johanna Nelson to Present at the CDFA Conference Toward Fellowship

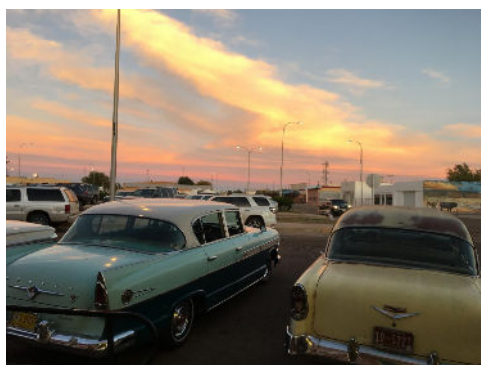

NMMS Fall Meeting Updates



Thanks to Tucumcari MainStreet for hosting the NMMS Fall Meeting!

New Mexico MainStreet held its Leadership Network meeting on Economic Vitality in Tucumcari, October 16-18.

Tucumcari MainStreet's team worked very hard to help organize the meeting's logistics and welcome the entire network. NMMS would like to give them a shout out and thank them for their generous hospitality & hard work!



Highlights from the meeting:

- Santa Rosa graduated from the accelerator program and is an accredited MainStreet community.
- New Mexico MainStreet certified two Executive Directors: Matt from Ruidoso and Mara from Lovington.
- Tucumcari MainStreet hosted an "Art in the Park" event for the community.

- The historic Odeon Theatre hosted a film screening fundraiser for their neon restoration project.
- Tucumcari MainStreet and Mesalands Community College partnered to have art students decorate unused downtown storefronts with their art. This collaboration is new and they will continue to work together because “art betters the community and local businesses.”
- Tucumcari MainStreet had four inquiries to rent the train depot baggage room for events -- evidence that NMMS meetings make an impact on the local economy.
- Participants at the meeting tested Tucumcari’s beta App “Tucumcari Story Trail.”
- Fast TV Network spoke with participants about their series “[Legends of Route 66](#),” which highlighted Tucumcari and Route 66.



Union Pacific Railroad Foundation Awards Grants to Alamogordo and Deming



Union Pacific's Community Ties Giving Program awarded Alamogordo MainStreet and Deming Luna County MainStreet \$20,000.

According to Union Pacific’s [press release](#), “these grants primarily provide funding in Union Pacific’s priority cause areas: safety, workforce development, and community spaces, while a smaller portion is allocated to assist communities with local needs.”

Deming Luna County MainStreet will use the funds for the Leyendecker lighting project at the Leyendecker Plaza in Downtown Deming. According to the [Deming Headlight](#), Union Pacific “has provided grant money to the Deming downtown revitalization programs for the past three years, including funds to help create the Arts Park in downtown Deming back in 2016.”

Alamogordo MainStreet will use the funds to create an informational and attractive public space within the existing Union Pacific-owned median property in the middle of 10th Street between Railroad Avenue and Eddy Drive. This project will pay tribute to Alamogordo’s railroad history through landscaping, minor tower maintenance, informational signage, MainStreet district wayfinding/walking map, and lighting.

Santa Rosa MainStreet Accreditation

Santa Rosa MainStreet has graduated from the MainStreet Accelerator program and is now an accredited New Mexico MainStreet community!

Santa Rosa was initially designated as a MainStreet community in 2006. Those initial efforts were not sustained, but the community reentered the network as a



Frontier Community initiative of the New Mexico MainStreet Program from 2015-2017. During that time, the community completed the Metropolitan Redevelopment Area (MRA) Revitalization Plan and provided support to the county for the renovation of the historic Pecos Theater in the heart of the downtown district which reopened in August of this year.

Santa Rosa MainStreet embarked on a number of projects to help revitalize their district including: completing a comprehensive economic analysis that helped clarify the boundaries of the core MainStreet district within the city-

adopted MRA; providing business development consultations to local entrepreneurs and prospective downtown business owners; implementing three façade improvement projects on downtown buildings; installing a mural project on Historic Route 66 by acclaimed muralist Doug Quarles; establishing an annual Valentine's Day fundraiser to generate resources for operations and projects; and initiating long-term planning and development of Economic Transformation Strategies.

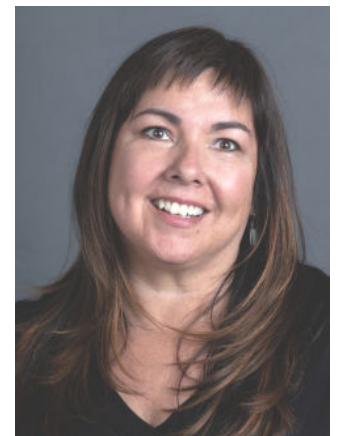


Carrie Wells Named New Deputy Director of the New Mexico Film Office
