The New Mexico Economic Development Department to Hold Statewide Town Halls to Discuss Local Economic Development Act (LEDA) Guidelines

Santa Fe, NM - The New Mexico Economic Development Department is taking public input through a series of five town hall meetings across the state to help develop guidelines for the Local Economic Development Act (LEDA) program. This is a process designed to put in place additional safeguards when deploying taxpayers' money.

"To effectively manage how taxpayer dollars will be spent for economic development recruitment and expansion projects, the Economic Development Department welcomes input and discussion from government officials, economic development professionals, the business community and general public alike," said Economic Development Secretary Jon Barela.

Upon taking office, the Martinez Administration administratively included clawbacks and job creation targets for projects receiving LEDA. In 2014, Governor Martinez signed into law a clawbacks statute in the event a project does not meet targets.
