## **Job Training Incentive Program Awards Nine Companies \$2,293,224.43 in November to Create 241 Jobs**

**Santa Fe, NM** - The New Mexico Economic Development Department's (NMEDD) Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP) Board approved \$2,293,224.43 in funding for nine companies to create 241 jobs in November. The next JTIP meeting will be Friday December 11 from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. at Rio Bravo Brewing Company located at 1912 2<sup>nd</sup> Street NW Albuquerque, NM 87102.

"JTIP is an important tool that businesses can use to grow their workforce," said Economic Development Secretary Jon Barela. "I'm glad to see new and expanding companies continue to utilize JTIP and I encourage other qualifying job creators to use this resource as well."

### **Novembers JTIP recipients were:**

**Y-Fab, LLC, Albuquerque** - Y Fab is a full service fabrication facility that has the capability to provide full service fabrication of fiberglass reinforced plastic, carbon steel, and stainless steel piping spools as well as galvanized and stainless steel HVAC. **7 jobs, \$62,468.80**

**Ideum, Inc., Corrales** - Ideum designs and creates interactive computer-based exhibits, multitouch installations, rich internet applications, social networking sites for museum and web visitors and several software products. **6 jobs, \$120,263.44**

**New Mexico Consortium, Los Alamos** - New Mexico Consortium is a partnership between the University of New Mexico, New Mexico State University, New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology and Los Alamos National Laboratory to advance scientific research and education in NM. The Job Training Incentive Program reimburses qualified economic-based companies for a portion of training costs associated with job creation. The program provides for classroom or on-the-job training, reimbursing an expanding or relocating business for up to 75 percent of a trainee's wages for as long as six months. The amount of the award depends on the number and complexity of jobs, the wages paid, and the business location.

To qualify, new or expanding companies must either create a product in New Mexico, or provide a nonretail service with 50 percent of the company's customer or revenue base outside of the state. The eligible jobs must be full-time and year-round. The trainee must be a new hire to the company and have been a New Mexico resident for at least one year at any time prior to being hired.
