
Quarterly Economic Summary Bernalillo County


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Bernalillo County has seen its matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR) trending upwards in the last eight quarters. Notable increases in MTGR can be seen in the Public Administration sector, as seen in Table 1, on the next page. Public Administration, while not having the highest real increase, had the highest percentage growth with a year over year increase of 2,135% from Q1 FY19 to Q1 FY20 growing from \$640K to \$14.3M respectively. This increase can be attributed to a large defense contract that was recently awarded to a company

within the county. In addition to this, a previously existing company began to pay taxes as a result of the legislative changes from House Bill 6 of the 2019 Legislative Session. Another notable increase can be seen in the educational services industry which saw a 114% increase.

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

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
Bernalillo County's Gross Receipts Tax (GRT) revenue has been increasing since FY15. Q1 FY20 saw an increase of \$4.8M in GRT revenue collections compared to Q1 FY19.

HB6, PASSED IN 2019, MADE WIDESPREAD TAX CHANGES WITHIN NEW MEXICO. ONE NOTABLE CHANGE IS THE CONVERSION TO DESTINATION-BASED SOURCING THAT WILL BEGIN AFTER A TWO YEAR DELAY. DURING THIS DELAY LOCAL GOVERNMENTS WILL RECEIVE A DISTRIBUTION THAT IS A PORTION OF \$2M EACH MONTH. THE PORTION DISTRIBUTED WILL BE BASED ON WHAT THE POPULATION OF EACH COUNTY IS TO THE TOTAL POPULATION OF ALL COUNTIES, AS PER THE MOST RECENT DECENNIAL CENSUS.

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


Chart 6. Quarterly Initial Unemployment Claims
