
## Quarterly Economic Summary Grant County






Grant County's matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR) has fluctuated but has remained relatively stable with the slightest upward trend over the last eight quarters, as seen in Chart 1. The Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation industry as well as the Administrative/Support & Waste Management/Remediation industry saw larger relative increases in MTGR in Q1 FY20 compared to Q1 FY19 428% increasing bν and 205% respectively. The Art industry was at a low point in Q1 FY19 and the current MTGR reported are more in line with

what has been seen historically. Utilities saw the largest decline across all industries, declining by nearly \$4M in Q1 FY20 compared to the same period of FY19, as seen in Table 1 on page 2. Utilities have been in decline for the previous two quarters.





Annual Gross Receipt Tax (GRT) revenue collections have continued an upward trend in the county, as seen in Chart 3. GRT revenue collections have fluctuated over the last eight quarters but are seeing a slight upward trend as seen in Chart 4. Revenue collections were up 4% in Q1 FY20 compared to the same quarter of FY19, an increase of \$55K.


HB6, PASSED IN 2019, MADE WIDESPREAD TAX CHANGES WITHIN NEW MEXICO. ONE NOTABLE CHANGE IS THE CONVERSION TO DESTINATION-BASED SOURCING THAT WILL BEGIN AFTER A TWO YEAR DELAY. DURING THIS DELAY LOCAL GOVERNMENTS WILL RECEIVE A DISTRIBUTION THAT IS A PORTION OF \$2M EACH MONTH. THE PORTION DISTRIBUTED WILL BE BASED ON WHAT THE POPULATION OF EACH COUNTY IS TO THE TOTAL POPULATION OF ALL COUNTIES, AS PER THE MOST RECENT DECENNIAL CENSUS.





