## Main Street America Awards Accreditation to the NM MainStreet Coordinating Program, 31 NM Program Partners

### *NM's 28 Accredited and 3 Affiliated Programs Receive Main Street Designation*

**Santa Fe, N.M.** – Today, the New Mexico Economic Development Department announced that Main Street America has reaccredited and licensed New Mexico MainStreet (NMMS) as a Coordinating Program. Additionally, Main Street America has designated New Mexico's 28 accredited and 3 affiliated Main Street™ programs for meeting rigorous performance standards. Each year, Main Street America and its partners announce the list of accredited & affiliated programs to recognize their exceptional commitment to preservation-based economic development and community revitalization through the Main Street Approach™.

“New Mexico's 31 Main Street programs work with their local partners to transform downtown districts into economically vibrant communities,” Economic Development Secretary Alicia J. Keyes said. “I commend our programs on their recognition from Main Street America and I'm confident to have them as partners in the next stage of economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.”
