One-time grants of \$10,000 are available to local small businesses and non-profits within the Albuquerque city limits that have 50 employees or fewer and meet other grant criteria. **Applications open on August 4.**

NEW! <u>FEMA COVID Funeral</u> <u>Expenses Program</u>

Eligible New Mexicans can apply for financial assistance through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for COVID-19 related funeral expenses. Call 844-684-6333 for assistance.

NEW! <u>Pandemic Assistance for</u> <u>Timber Harvesters and Haulers</u>

NEW! EDA's Coal Communities <u>Commitment</u>

EDA's Coal Communities Commitment allocates \$300M of the American Rescue Plan appropriation to support coal communities as they recover from the pandemic and help them create new jobs and opportunities, including the creation or expansion of a new industry sector.

NEW! <u>Streamlined PPP Application</u> <u>Portal Open</u>

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is launching a streamlined application portal to allow borrowers with Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans of \$150,000 or less through participating lenders to apply for forgiveness directly through the SBA.

<u>The American Rescue Plan Grants to</u> <u>Organizations</u>

Supports jobs and organizations in the arts sector in COVID-19 response and recovery. Funds support day-to-day business expenses and operating costs. **Deadline: August 12.**

NEW! <u>New Mexico Gas Company</u> Small Business COVID Relief Fund

The fund provides financial assistance to small businesses that are struggling with their utility bills. Small businesses could be eligible for a onetime credit of 50 cents for every dollar paid, up to a maximum credit of \$250. **Deadline: March 31, 2022 or until all funds have been allocated.**

Small Business Boost (SBB)

SBB funds may be used in financing the startup or expansion of a small business.

This Week's Highlight: Outdoor Recreation Trails+ Grant

The **Outdoor Recreation Trails+ Grant**, (formerly known as the Special Projects and Outdoor Infrastructure Fund) invests in outdoor infrastructure – from trails to boat ramps to public shooting ranges, and much more.

The grant is open for applications until August 31 at 5PM MT.

Funding for this year has increased by a factor of almost seven, up from \$75,000 in FY21 to \$500,000 in FY22. Eligible entities include: Tribes, Pueblos, and Nations; municipalities; counties; nonprofits; public preschools, schools, and districts; colleges and universities; soil and water conservation districts; and acequia associations.

Community Resources

NEW! Native Youth and Culture Fund

The fund provides support for projects that focus on youth and incorporate the perpetuation of traditional ecological knowledge, spirituality, and the intergenerational transfer of knowledge systems, resulting in compassion, respect, dignity, reverence for nature, and care for each other and the earth. Approximately 30 general operating grants ranging from \$5,000 to \$25,000 will be provided to Native-controlled nonprofit and community organizations. **Deadline: August 19.**

NEW! Good Green Giving Grant Program

This grant program supports nonprofit organizations working in underserved communities to create opportunity and change in three key areas: education, employment and expungement. Five grants of at least \$60,000 will be provided. **Deadline: August 18.**

REMINDER: Outdoor Recreation Division (ORD) Infrastructure Survey

ORD has funding to support needed infrastructure along the Rio Grande Trail and is seeking community input on potential shovel-ready projects. This is not an application, only an initial survey. **Deadline to respond: Aug 31.**

REMINDER: Wallace Foundation

The Foundation helps arts organizations of color leverage their experience and histories of community orientation to increase their resilience, while sustaining relevance. The foundation is seeking to form an initial cohort of ten to 12 organizations who are 1) interested in or planning to make strategic changes using community-oriented approaches; 2) committed to contributing to the research base on the history and current practices of arts organizations of color; and 3) interested in and well-suited to learn from other arts organizations of color. Each grantee in the first cohort will receive five years of funding totaling approximately \$2-3 million. **Deadline: August 13.**

NEW! Cornerstone Conservation Grant

The American Alpine Club's Cornerstone Conservation Grant, funded by REI, creates healthy climbing landscapes, promotes respect for the places people climb, and empowers local climbing communities. Grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$8,000 are provided for projects that improve land conservation and

climber practices. Nonprofit organizations or organizations with nonprofit fiscal sponsors are eligible to apply. **Deadline: August 15**.

NEW! Areas of Persistent Poverty Program

The program supports projects that will improve transit services or facilities in areas of persistent poverty through planning, engineering, technical studies, or financial plans for projects. **Deadline: August 30.**

NEW! <u>Children's Healthy Learning Environments in Low-Income and/or</u> <u>Minority Communities Grant</u>

This program supports capacity building activities to address disproportionate children's environmental health harms and risks in school or childcare settings in, or that primarily serve, low-income or minority communities. Projects should be multi-media and holistic. **Deadline: September 10.**

Healthy Homes and Weatherization Cooperation Demonstration

Grants for demonstration projects in localities that are served by both Healthy Homes and Weatherization Assistance Programs to improve coordination between the programs with respect to the implementation of healthy homes remediation activities and energy conservation measures. **Deadline: August 17.**

Rural Cooperative Development Grant

Grants assist individuals or entities in the startup, expansion, or operational improvement of rural cooperatives and other business entities. Grants are awarded to Rural Cooperative Development Centers. **Deadline: August 10.**

Wellness for All Grant

\$10,000 grants support women of color entrepreneurs and organizations committed to making wellness and fitness more accessible and inclusive to female BIPOC communities. **Deadline: August 13.**

The Socially-Disadvantaged Groups Grant

Provides technical assistance to socially-disadvantaged groups in rural areas, including feasibility studies, business plans, strategic planning, and leadership training. **Deadline: August 9.**
