NEW! American Rescue Plan Build Back Better Regional Challenge

In phase 1, the Economic Development Administration (EDA) will provide technical assistance grants to 50-60 coalitions (through a lead institution). In phase 2, the EDA will award each of the 20-30 finalists between \$25M and \$75M (potentially up to \$100M) to fund the collection of projects they identified. The projects will be funded through grants to coalition members. **Deadline: October 19.**

NEW! CERF+ COVID-19 Relief Grant

CERF+ the Artists Safety Net will provide \$1,000 to artists working in craft disciplines who are facing dire circumstances due to food, housing, or medical insecurities as a result of the ongoing pandemic. **Deadline: August 31.**

NEW! Food Coalition Call for Proposals

The Food and Agriculture Organization of the U.N. Call for Proposals to mobilize political commitment, technical and financial support for countries affected by the COVID-19 pandemic is inviting its members to join their efforts and build coalitions across countries and with non-state actors who have mutual interest in addressing concrete challenges around selected priority areas of work. **Deadline: September 18.**

NEW! The Brave of Heart Fund

For eligible family members of frontline healthcare workers and healthcare volunteers who have lost their lives due to COVID-19. Grants will provide basic and continuing financial support for common needs, such as funeral costs, medical care, counseling, food, educational expenses, mortgage or rent payments, and immediate living expenses. **Deadline: December 31.**

Employee Retention Credit

The Employee Retention Credit allows small businesses negatively affected by COVID to offset their current payroll tax liabilities by up to \$7,000 per employee per quarter. See the flyer.

On-Site Vaccination Clinic Toolkit

This toolkit helps community groups, employers, and other host organizations work directly with vaccine providers to set up vaccination clinics.

Emergency Rural Health Care Grants

This program provides up to \$500 million in grant funding to help broaden access to COVID-19 testing and vaccines, rural health care services, and food assistance through food banks and food

infrastructure grants

Treasury Announces Seven Additional Policies to Encourage State and Local Governments to Expedite Emergency Rental Assistance distribution facilities. Public bodies, nonprofits, and Tribes located in rural areas (population of 20k or less) may apply.

NEW! NMSBA Leveraged Projects

The New Mexico Small Business Assistance (NMSBA) Program pairs small businesses facing a technical challenge with scientists at New Mexico's national laboratories. At no cost to the business, small businesses can seek assistance from lab scientists and engineers to solve challenges and overcome barriers to company success. Leveraged project awards range from \$40,000 to \$120,000 in services. **Deadline: September 14.**

Amazon Black Business Accelerator

Provides access to financial support, strategic business guidance and mentorship, and marketing and promotional support. \$900+ in financial assistance to access services and grants to help jump-start business growth and customer acquisition.

SBA's Disaster Preparedness Plan

Severe weather, like tropical storms, wildfires, and extreme heat, can disrupt your small business. The SBA has resources to help you prepare when a disaster strikes.

Cybersecurity Maturity Model Certification (CMMC) Training

CyberReady Workshop will prepare companies for CMMC and also help businesses become more cybersecure. Open to all businesses. Runs Sept. 14, 15, & 17; \$200 per business. **Deadline: September 6. Click here to view the flyer...**

NEW! Yamaha Outdoor Access Initiative

Support is provided to nonprofit and tax-exempt groups, including clubs and associations, public riding areas, outdoor enthusiast associations, land conservation organizations, and communities with an interest in protecting, improving, expanding, or maintaining access for safe, responsible, and sustainable use by motorized off-road vehicles. **Upcoming deadlines: September 30 and December 15.**

NEW! Cigna Foundation: Health and Well-Being Grants

The foundation seeks to partner with nonprofit organizations who are addressing the root causes of health inequity, including supporting under-resourced and systemically disadvantaged communities with poor social determinants of health. Programs should focus on chronic disease treatment and prevention, mental and/or behavioral health conditions, dental health, wellness programs, or maternal, prenatal, and newborn health. Grants will range between \$50,000 and \$100,000 per year

for up to three years. Deadline: September 24.

NEW! Brownfields Job Training Grants

Grants support programs that recruit, train, and place unemployed and underemployed residents with the skills needed to secure full-time employment in the environmental field. The program seeks to further environmental justice by ensuring that residents living in communities historically affected by economic disinvestment, health disparities, and environmental contamination, including low-income, minority, and tribal communities, have an opportunity to reap the benefits of revitalization and environmental cleanup. The grants support training in brownfield assessment or cleanup activities, as well as training in Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response (HAZWOPER). **Deadline: October 5.**

NEW! Disability Housing Grants for Veterans

U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs offers housing grants for veterans and service members with certain service-connected disabilities so they can buy or change a home to meet their needs and live more independently. Changing a home might involve installing ramps or widening doorways.

Rural Microentrepreneur Assistance Program (RMAP)

RMAP provides direct loans and grants to Microenterprise Development Organizations (MDO). Grant funds are used by the MDO to provide technical assistance and entrepreneurship training to rural individuals and businesses. **Deadline: June 30, 2022.**

Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC)

The BRIC program makes federal funds available to states, U.S territories, federally recognized tribal governments, and local communities for hazard mitigation activities, in recognition of the growing hazards associated with climate change. **Deadline: January 28, 2022.**

Aura Cacia: Positive Change Project

Grants support organizations and programs that enable disadvantaged women and girls to become more stable and self-sufficient; employ strategies to help women and girls live healthfully and purposefully; reinforce positive self-image, self-respect, and self-confidence in women and girls; and create opportunities for women to drive curriculum or programming that can be applied to program development and mentoring other women. **Deadline: September 30.**

Sphinx Venture Fund

The Sphinx Venture Fund supports highly impactful programs offered by nonprofit organizations that address cultural diversity, equity, and inclusion in the performing arts, with an emphasis on classical music. Grants range from \$50,000 to \$100,000. **Deadline: September 30.**
