UPDATE! <u>Deferment of Principal</u> <u>and Interest Payments for EIDL</u>

The SBA will provide additional deferment of principal and interest payments for existing Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) borrowers for 30 months from inception. This deferment extension is effective for all EIDL loans approved in calendar years 2020, 2021, and 2022.

The REAP program is designed to help rural businesses and agricultural producers purchase or install renewable energy systems or make energy efficiency improvements. Funds may be used for the purchase, installation, and construction of renewable energy systems. Grant amounts range from \$2,500 to \$500,000. **Deadline: March 31.**

NEW! New Mexico Clean and Beautiful

Competitive grants for funding and technical assistance available to municipalities, counties, and tribal governments for litter eradication, waste reduction, and community beautification initiatives. **Deadline: April 15.**

NEW! Low or No Emission Grant Program

DOT will provide funding for the purchase or lease of zero-emission and low-emission transit buses, including acquisition, construction, and leasing of required supporting facilities such as recharging, refueling, and maintenance facilities. **Deadline: May 31.**

NEW! <u>RFP: Investment Connection</u>

Opportunity to submit a proposal and connect with funders. Presentations will take place on May 12 in person. If you are interested in being considered for one of the eight presenters, please submit your proposal as soon as possible. **Deadline: April 11.**

NEW! Infrastructure and Capacity Building Challenge Grants

Capital projects support the design, purchase, construction, restoration, or renovation of facilities for humanities activities. Digital infrastructure projects support the maintenance, modernization, and sustainability of existing digital scholarly projects and platforms. For both capital projects and digital infrastructure, expenditures must be shown to bring long-term benefits to the institution and to the humanities more broadly. **Deadline: May 17.**

NEW! Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program

The Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program provides mandatory funds to support education, mentoring, and technical assistance initiatives for beginning farmers and ranchers. **Deadline: May 19.**

Boots to Business Follow On Training

The purpose of the opportunity is to invite proposals for funding from eligible private and non-profit organizations, local and state government agencies, and institutions of higher education to provide synchronous online entrepreneurship training to transitioning service members, veterans, and military spouses. The entrepreneurship training should be a continuation of the training participants receive as part of SBA's Boots to Business (B2B) Training Program or the Boots to Business Reboot (B2BR) Training Program. **Deadline: April 11.**

Drivers and Environmental Impacts of Energy Transitions in Underserved Communities

The EPA is seeking applications proposing community-engaged research that will address the drivers and environmental impacts of energy transitions in underserved communities. **Deadline: April 28.**

Healthy Soil Program Grant

Grant funding may be used for on-the-ground projects that focus on one or more of five basic soil health principles: keeping the soil covered; minimizing soil disturbance on cropland; maximizing biodiversity; maintaining a living root; and integrating animals into land management. **Deadline: May 12.**

Community Facilities Technical Assistance and Training Grant

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is accepting applications to help rural communities expand their capacity to access financial resources to support the construction or upgrade of essential community facilities. The grants allow eligible public bodies as well as private and nonprofit organizations to provide technical assistance and training to help grantees identify and plan for community facility needs in their area. USDA is offering priority points to projects that advance key priorities to help communities recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, advance equity, and combat climate change. **Deadline: May 23**.

Growth Opportunities

These grants focus on youth and young adults most impacted by community violence, particularly in

areas of concentrated crime and poverty or that have recently experienced significant unrest. The goals of the grant are to: help youth and young adults improve conflict resolution skills and develop strategies to prevent and avoid violence; introduce and prepare youth for the world of work; help youth identify career interests, attain relevant skills, and gain work experience; and provide income to youth. **Deadline: April 21.**

Workforce Pathways for Youth

These grants will place an emphasis on age-appropriate (14-21) workforce readiness programming to expand job training and workforce pathways for youth, including soft skill development, career exploration, job readiness and certification, summer jobs, year-round job opportunities, and apprenticeships. **Deadline: April 25.**

<u>Community Placemaking Grants</u>

Project for Public Spaces' Community Placemaking Grants enable US-based nonprofits and government agencies to address the inequality of access by working directly with local stakeholders to transform public spaces or co-create new ones. \$40,000 in funding for physical and programmatic improvements to a public space. This includes design, research, community engagement, and implementation support from the Project for Public Spaces. **Deadline: April 15.**

Buses and Bus Facilities Competitive Program

This program will assist in the financing of buses and bus facilities capital projects, including replacing, rehabilitating, purchasing, or leasing buses or related equipment, and rehabilitating, purchasing, constructing, or leasing bus-related facilities. **Deadline: May 31.**

Low or No Emission Grant Program

This program supports the transition of the nation's transit fleet to the lowest polluting and most energy efficient transit vehicles. **Deadline: May 31.**
