Expansion to Mexican side of Santa Teresa Port of Entry expected to boost business, traffic in New Mexico fire. A maximum of \$5,000 in assistance can be requested for rent, utilities, mortgage payments, damage deposits, or home repairs.

#### **NEW! <u>USDA Rural Development Increases</u>** <u>Grant Fund Limits for Those Homes</u> <u>Damaged by Forest Fires</u>

The Rural Development's 504 repair grant and loan program helps homeowners repair, improve, or modernize their homes or provides grants to elderly low-income homeowners to repair their homes. An additional 1% loan up to \$40,000 is also available to residents of rural areas of less than 20,000, including those affected by the forest fires.

#### **NEW!** <u>Next Generation Warning System</u> <u>Grant Program</u>

FEMA's Integrated Public Alert & Warning System (IPAWS) is the national system for local alerting that provides authenticated emergency and life-saving information to the public. Local radio and TV stations, along with cable, direct broadcast satellite, and wireless service providers, disseminate the public safety messages they receive from IPAWS. **Deadline: Sept 14.** 

### **NEW!** <u>Resiliency in Communities After Stress and Trauma</u>

The purpose of this program is to promote resilience, trauma-informed approaches, and equity in communities that have recently faced civil unrest, community violence, and/or collective trauma within the past 24 months; and assist high-risk youth and families through the implementation of evidence-based violence prevention and community youth engagement programs. **Deadline: Oct 17.** 

### President Biden Amends New Mexico Disaster Declaration

Under the President's order, the federal share for debris removal and emergency protective measures, including direct federal assistance, has been increased to 100% of the total eligible costs for a 90-day period from the date of declaration.

### Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant

The grants are being offered to community fire departments that help 10,000 people or less. **Deadline: Sept 30.** 

### Prepare for Flash Flooding in Burn Scar Areas

Call 833-663-6248 if you will need assistance should an evacuation occur. If you cannot evacuate, get to higher ground as soon as you can.

### NEW! Rural Economic Development Loan and Grant

Program provides funding for rural projects through local utility organizations. USDA provides zerointerest loans to local utilities which they, in turn, pass along to local businesses (ultimate recipients) for projects that will create and retain employment in rural areas. The ultimate recipients repay the lending utility directly. The utility then is responsible for repayment to USDA. **Deadline: June 30**, **2023.** 

### NEW! USDA Regional Food Business Centers Funding Opportunity

The Regional Food Business Centers will assist small and mid-sized producers and food and farm

businesses with the goal of creating a more resilient, diverse, and competitive food system. **Deadline: Nov 22.** 

### NEW! National Research Service Award (NRSA) Institutional Research Training Grant

Grants to eligible nonprofits and small businesses to enhance predoctoral and postdoctoral research training and ensure that a diverse and highly-trained workforce is available and committed to the generation, translation, and dissemination of new scientific evidence and analytical tools that will be used to improve health care delivery. **Deadline: December 1.**

### NEW! Rural Microentrepreneur Assistance Program

The program's purpose is to help microenterprises startup and growth through a Rural Microloan Revolving Fund and provide training and technical assistance to microloan borrowers and micro entrepreneurs. **Deadline: June 2023.** 

### NEW! Sustainable Agriculture Research and Education Program

The purpose of this program is to encourage research and outreach designed to increase knowledge concerning agricultural production systems that maintain and enhance the quality and productivity of the soil; conserve soil, water, energy, natural resources, and fish and wildlife habitat; maintain and enhance the quality of surface and groundwater; protect the health and safety of persons involved in the food and farm system; promote the well-being of animals; and increase employment opportunities in agriculture. **Deadline: Nov 14.** 

### NEW! The Distressed Cities Technical Assistance (DCTA) Program

30 local governments in New Mexico are eligible for free, federally-funded, technical support to address tough challenges like improving housing, economic development, and enhancing operations, financial strength, and overall economic competitiveness.

### **NEW! Safeguarding Tomorrow through Ongoing Risk Mitigation Revolving Loan Fund** <u>Program</u>

Capitalization grants to states and Indian Tribal Governments to establish hazard mitigation revolving loan funds. Loans from a revolving loan fund may then be made to local governments to carry out hazard mitigation projects that reduce disaster risks. **Deadline: May 31, 2023.** 

### **NEW!** <u>T-Mobile Hometown Grants</u>

Focused on revitalizing community spaces in towns with 50,000 people or less. Submit a proposal for a town project of your choice, and if selected, use the funds to get started. Awards to up to 100 towns a year with project funding up to \$50,000 each.

### Round 4 of ReConnect

The program provides funding to expand high-speed internet access.

- Grants: \$700 million
- Loan/grant combinations: \$300 million
- Loans: \$150 million

### <u>Strategies for Low-Income Participation in New Mexico's Community Solar Program:</u> <u>Best Practices and Recommendations</u>

New Mexico has an opportunity to demonstrate the successful participation of low-income communities in the rollout of its statewide community solar program. New Mexico will have one of the largest low-income carve-outs, at 30%, of any state program. While there remain a number of challenges to overcome to ensure that households in greatest need have easy access to and receive meaningful financial benefits from participation, there exists many best practices that can be tailored to New Mexico's context.
