






In the first quarter of FY23, 25 of 33 counties saw significant year-over-year economic growth. Statewide economic activity showed broad growth across most industry sectors, with oil and gas and construction leading the growth in gross receipts over the prior year. Concerns like interest rates and inflation continued, leaving consumer confidence declining on the national level. Despite these concerns, New Mexico has had continued growth, with record-breaking gross receipts.

Lincoln County's matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR) increased \$50.9M or nearly 29% from Q4 FY21 to Q1 FY23, as seen in Chart 1. The amount of MTGR reported during Q1 FY23 (\$228.9M) is \$48M more than the eight-quarter average reported for Lincoln County (\$180.9M). As seen in Chart 2, the largest industry as a percentage of MTGR was the retail trade industry, which accounted for 28% of the total MTGR during Q1 FY23.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) are the best tax data available to show underlying economic activity. The data collection process matches a tax payment with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.


Table 1 shows that 14 industries reported a year-overyear (YOY) increase with the largest reported increase coming from the retail trade industry. The retail trade industry reported a YOY increase of \$7.9M or 14%. The construction industry reported a YOY decrease of \$5M or 11%.


The amount of quarterly gross receipts taxes (GRT) collected during Q1 FY23 (\$721K) was 56% more than the amount collected during Q4 FY22 (\$462K), as seen in Chart 4. Despite this large quarterly increase in GRT collections, Lincoln County's GRT has a slight upward trend over the last 8 quarters.



An **establishment**, as used in the QCEW and subsequently Chart 6 and Table 2, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, which produces goods or provides services at a single physical worksite and engaged, predominantly, in one type of economic activity.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the value of all goods and services produced in an area. The percentage that GDP grew (or shrank) from one period to another is an important indicator as to how the economy is performing. Table 2, below, shows the percentage of GDP each industry accounts for in the total GDP, in a specific county and the state. The chart also compares the county to the entire state of New Mexico, by showing the impact of specific industry sectors on the county's GDP compared to that of the whole state.


