

In the first quarter of FY23, 25 of 33 counties saw significant year-over-year economic growth. Statewide economic activity showed broad growth across most industry sectors, with oil and gas and construction leading the growth in gross receipts over the prior year. Concerns like interest rates and inflation have continued, leaving consumer confidence declining on the national level. Despite these concerns, New Mexico has had continued growth, with record-breaking gross receipts.

Over the last eight quarters, matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR), has averaged \$59M which is \$4M less than the amount reported during Q1 FY23 (\$63M). From Q4 FY22 to Q1 FY23, MTGR decreased by nearly 4% or just over \$2.5M. Despite this decline, MTGR for Socorro County, has an upward trend. As seen in Chart 2, the construction and retail trade industries have accounted for 46% of Socorro County's total MTGR.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) are the best tax data available to show underlying economic activity. The data collection process matches a tax payment with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.

Chart 2. FY23 - Q1 Industry Size by Matched Taxable






Table 1 shows that, when comparing year-over-year (YOY) MTGR, the largest contribution came from the retail trade industry. This industry accounted for over 41% of the total YOY increase that Socorro County reported. The largest decline was reported by the manufacturing industry which posted a YOY decline of \$40K or 3%. The amount of quarterly gross receipts taxes (GRT) collected during Q1 FY23 (\$613K) was 4% less than the amount collected during Q4 FY22 (\$640K), as seen in Chart 4. With this quarterly decline in GRT collections, Socorro County's GRT has a flat trend over the last 8 quarters.

chart also compares the county to the entire state of New


Mexico, by showing the impact of specific industry sectors


