



New Mexico's total matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR) increased to an all-time high in Q2 FY23. This is the 3rd consecutive quarter that an all-time has been reached. From Q1 FY23 to Q2 FY23 MTGR increased by \$263M or 1.1%. Over the last four quarters MTGR has averaged \$22.44B, or \$1.3B less than the amount reported during Q2 FY23 (\$23.7B). Chart 2 shows the largest contributor to the quarterly MTGR, the retail trade industry (23%). Over the last four quarters the retail trade industry has accounted for over 21% of the state's total quarterly MTGR. From Q1 FY23 to Q2 FY23 the retail trade

industry increased by 2%. Table 1, on the next page, shows that the largest year-overyear (YOY) increase in MTGR came from the oil and gas industry. When comparing the two time periods the oil and industry grew by \$1.1B or 63%. The gas oil and industry accounted for nearly 34% of the YOY increase New Mexico experienced. Despite the state's growth, four industries reported YOY decline with the largest decline coming from the finance and insurance industry.







The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages or the QCEW, used in Charts 4-5, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state and national). Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.



The value of all goods and services produced in New Mexico is the **Gross Domestic Product (GDP)**. The percentage that GDP grew (or shrank) from one period to another is an important way for the state to gauge how the economy is performing. GDP in Chart 7-8 and Table 2 are real GDP in chained 2012 dollars.





