The New Mexico Cash Assistance Fund

One-time cash assistance of \$1,000 to New Mexicans who have been adversely impacted by the Black, Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon, Cerro Pelado, Cook's Peak, and McBride wildfires or floods. Applicants must live in the counties of San Miguel, Mora, Colfax, Lincoln, Sandoval, or Sierra. Applicants from San Miguel, Mora, and Colfax Counties will be highly prioritized. Applications are open until they reach a limit of 1,000 and will be randomized for approval.

T-Mobile Hometown Grant Program

Helps fund projects to build, rebuild, or refresh community spaces that help foster local connections in your town. This may include a town square pavilion, historic building, outdoor park, ball field, or library. Up to \$50,000 for communities with populations less than 50,000. **Deadline: March 31.**

CDFA Community Facilities Technical Assistance Program for Tribal Communities

Community Compass Technical Assistance and Capacity Building Program

Community Compass helps HUD's customers navigate complex housing and community development challenges by equipping them with the knowledge, skills, tools, capacity, and systems to implement HUD programs and policies successfully and sustainably, and to provide effective administrative and managerial oversight of HUD funding. **Deadline: March 28.**

J.M.K. Innovation Prize

Identifies, supports, and elevates innovators who are spearheading transformative early-stage projects in the fields of the environment, heritage conservation, and social justice. Prize includes a cash award of \$150,000 paid over three years and \$25,000 in technical assistance funds for a total award of \$175,000. Informational webinar on March 28. **Deadline: April 28.**

Tourism Event Growth & Sustainability Program

Program provides technical assistance, marketing, and sponsorship to qualified tourism events within New Mexico to support their growth and sustainability. Secures marketing and advertising for events through a 2:1 matching investment marketing program. Awarded events select from a media menu up to an award amount of \$10,000. Applications open: March 21 - April 21.

Healthy Soil Program

Grant funding for on-the-ground projects that focus on one or more of the five soil health principles: keeping the soil covered, minimizing soil disturbance on cropland, maximizing biodiversity, maintaining a living root, and integrating animals into land management. Applications accepted from **February 17 until April 21.**

Route 66 Corridor Preservation Program

Program will fund the preservation, restoration, and rehabilitation of transportation-related historic properties on Route 66, as well as planning, research, and educational programming related to Route 66. Grants will range from \$5,000 to \$30,000. **Deadline: April 14.**
