An economic development initiative designed to drive regional technology- and innovation-centric growth by strengthening a region's capacity to manufacture, commercialize, and deploy critical technologies. This program will invest directly in regions with the assets, resources, capacity, and potential to transform into globally competitive innovation centers in approximately 10 years while catalyzing the creation of good jobs for American workers at all skill levels, both equitably and inclusively.

The purpose of this program is to provide technical assistance to employers (which may include public sector entities) and labor unions to encourage employment of women in Registered Apprenticeship and nontraditional occupations. Applicants must be community-based organizations. **Deadline May 29.**

Monthly small business and startup grants of up to \$25,000 available.



# **Community Resources**

### **Sustaining New Mexico Fund**

This fund will award grants to organizations that align with their priority fields of interest: community resilience, educational opportunities, environmental adaptability, healthy communities, and rural infrastructure. Their mission is to strengthen communities by promoting social equity and supporting self-sufficiency to improve the quality of life for all New Mexicans. **Deadline: June 7.** 

### **The Rural Community Development Initiative**

This grant program supports organizations that are seeking to provide a program of financial and technical assistance to recipients to develop their capacity and ability to undertake projects related to housing, community facilities, or community and economic development. **Deadline: June 28.** 

### The Community Connect Grant Program

Provides financial assistance to applicants that will provide service at or above the Broadband Grant Speed to all premises in rural, economically-challenged communities where broadband service does not exist. **Deadline: June 20.** 

### **Digital Projects for the Public**

This program supports projects that interpret and analyze humanities content in primarily digital platforms and formats. **Deadline: June 14.** 

### **Rural Cooperative Development Grant**

The grant aims to improve the economic condition of rural areas by helping individuals and businesses start, expand, or improve rural cooperatives and other mutually owned businesses through Cooperative Development Centers. Eligible entities include nonprofits and institutions of higher learning. **Deadline: June 26.** 

### **Energizing Rural Communities Prize**

The \$15 million prize challenges individuals and organizations to develop partnership plans or innovative financing strategies to help rural or remote communities improve their energy systems and

advance clean energy demonstration projects. Deadline: May 24.

### **Rural Housing Preservation Grant**

Provides grant funds to qualified public agencies and private nonprofit organizations to assist very low- and low-income homeowners in repairing and rehabilitating their homes in rural areas. The program also assists rental property owners and cooperative housing complexes to repair and rehabilitate their units if they agree to make such units available to low- and very low-income persons. **Deadline: June 5.** 

### **STEM Talent Challenge**

Program aims to build STEM talent training systems to strengthen regional innovation economies. The FY23 STEM Talent Challenge will award a total of \$4.5 million in grants to organizations that are creating and implementing STEM talent development strategies that complement their region's innovation economy. **Deadline is June 12.** 

### Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) Discretionary Grant Program

The purpose of this grant is to strategically deploy publicly accessible electric vehicle charging and alternative fueling infrastructure in the places people live and work and along designated Alternative Fuel Corridors (AFCs). **Deadline: May 30.** 

### FEMA's Public Assistance Program

Provides supplemental grants to state, Tribal, territorial, and local governments, and certain types of private nonprofits so communities can quickly respond to and recover from major disasters or emergencies.
