LULAC Hiring Event

Featuring more than 500 job opportunities, with hiring onsite from more than 45 federal agencies and private organizations. This year's expo is part of LULAC's 93rd Annual Convention which will bring Latino leaders and elected officials from around the country to Albuquerque to discuss the most pressing issues affecting the Latino community and to set priorities and legislative agendas ahead of the 2024 election cycle. **August 2 - 4 at the Albuquerque Convention Center**.

<u>Single Family Housing Section 504 Home Repair Loans and Grants in Presidentially</u> <u>Declared Disaster Areas (PDDAs) Pilot Program</u>

The Rural Housing Service is issuing this notification to waive four regulatory requirements for the pilot program. The Agency's intention is to evaluate the existing regulations and remove regulatory barriers to assist eligible applicants in PDDAs to improve the program usage for very-low-income homeowners that are seeking to repair their damaged homes. This notification briefly discusses the four waivers and provides contact information for additional details about the pilot.

Northern Rio Grande Heritage Area (NRGNHA) Grants

Communities, Tribal and local governments, land grant associations, nonprofit organizations, youth programs, historical and archaeological societies, and preservation groups are encouraged to apply for grant funding of up to \$10,000 that supports the NRGNHA's vision and goals. Email above link to request an application. **Deadline: September 15.**

Tech Hubs

Designed to drive regional technology- and innovation-centric growth by strengthening a region's capacity to manufacture, commercialize, and deploy critical technologies. This program will invest directly in regions with the assets, resources, capacity, and potential to transform into globally competitive innovation centers within approximately 10 years, while catalyzing the creation of good jobs at all skill levels, equitably and inclusively. **Deadline Phase 1: August 15.**

Underserved and Indigenous Community Microgrids

Specifically focused to conduct research, development and demonstrations (RD&D) to develop and implement replicable microgrid solutions for underserved and Indigenous communities in remote and islanded regions throughout the US. **Deadline: September 15.**

Tribal College Small Business Achievement Grant

Provides funding for up to four Tribal Colleges and Universities that provide entrepreneurial development services to Native American communities, focusing on supplying services to socially and economically disadvantaged entrepreneurs in locations outside of the geographical areas of existing SBA resources. **Deadline: August 5.**

Solar for All

Awards up to 60 grants to states, territories, Tribal governments, municipalities, and nonprofits to expand the number of low-income and disadvantaged communities primed for distributed solar investment. Grantees will use funds to expand existing low-income solar programs or design and deploy new Solar for All programs nationwide. **Deadline: Sept. 26.**

Neighborhood Access and Equity Program

Supports economically disadvantaged or underserved communities in planning, capital construction activities, and regional partnerships that aim to restore community connectivity through the removal, retrofit, mitigation, or replacement of highways, roadways, or other infrastructure facilities that create barriers to mobility, access, or economic development. **Deadline: September 28.**

Affordable Connectivity Program

Provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward internet service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a onetime discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.
