Community Resources

Community Food Projects Competitive Grant Program

Brings together stakeholders from distinct parts of the food system to foster understanding of national food security trends and how they might improve local food systems. Understanding that people with low income experience disproportionate access to healthy foods, projects should address food and nutrition security, particularly among our nation's most vulnerable populations. **Deadline: October 30.**

Clean Communities Investment Accelerator

A competitive program that will provide grants to 2–7 hub nonprofits that provide funding and technical assistance to specific industry networks of public, quasi-public, not-for-profit, and nonprofit community lenders, supporting the goal that every community in the country has access to the capital they need to deploy clean technology projects in their homes, small businesses, schools, and community institutions. These community lenders could include community development financial institutions (including Certified Native CDFIs), credit unions, green banks, housing finance agencies, minority depository institutions, and other types of lenders. **Deadline: October 12.**

Rural Energy Savings Program

Provides funds to decrease the cost of energy for rural communities and small businesses by installing energy efficiency measures. Provides loans to rural utilities and other companies who provide energy efficiency loans to qualified consumers to implement durable cost-effective energy efficiency measures. **Applications accepted year round.**

Northeastern Regional Health Fund

Supports organizations doing health-related work in the counties of San Miguel, Mora, Guadalupe, Colfax, Harding, Union, and Quay. Awards grants to groups that work to improve the health and wellbeing of community members by providing access to healthcare services (including mental health) or health awareness and/or education programs. **Deadline: September 25.**

NATIVE Act Tribal Tourism Cooperative Agreement

Provides funding for Tribes to conduct feasibility studies to help them make informed decisions about potential tourism projects. **Deadline: September 29.**

Outdoor Recreation Trails+ Grant

Invests in conservation-minded shovel-ready projects that show demonstrable benefit to the local community, either by attracting/retaining residents or attracting visitors. The project must be open for public use (projects on Tribal lands do not have to be open to the public but should be open to Tribal members). **Deadline: Open until all funds are expended, apply early.**

Empowering Rural America Program

Provides rural utilities services with loan and grant funds to achieve the greatest reduction in greenhouse gas emissions while advancing the long-term resiliency, reliability, and affordability of rural electric systems. **Deadline: September 15.**

Underserved and Indigenous Community Microgrids

Specifically focused to conduct research, development and demonstrations (RD&D) to develop and implement replicable microgrid solutions for underserved and Indigenous communities in remote and islanded regions throughout the US. **Deadline: September 15.**

Solar for All

Awards up to 60 grants to states, territories, Tribal governments, municipalities, and nonprofits to expand the number of low-income and disadvantaged communities primed for distributed solar investment. Grantees will use funds to expand existing low-income solar programs or design and deploy new Solar for All programs nationwide. **Deadline: September 26.**

Neighborhood Access and Equity Program

Supports economically disadvantaged or underserved communities in planning, capital construction activities, and regional partnerships that aim to restore community connectivity through the removal, retrofit, mitigation, or replacement of highways, roadways, or other infrastructure facilities that create barriers to mobility, access, or economic development. **Deadline: September 28.**
