EDD Announcements

Small Business Innovation Research/Small Business Technology Transfer (NM SBIR/STTR) matching grants

Up to \$100,000 to accelerate commercialization of technologies developed with the aid of the federal SBIR awards. Attending the informational webinar on October 12 is required for all applicants. Applications due November 13.

Outdoor Recreation Trails+ Grant

Invests in conservation-minded shovel-ready projects that show demonstrable benefit to the local community, either by attracting/retaining residents or attracting visitors.

Deadline: Open until all funds are expended, apply early.

Outdoor Equity Fund

Supports transformative outdoor experiences that foster stewardship and respect for New Mexico's lands, waters, and cultural heritage.

Deadline: December 31.

Business Resources

Fearless Strivers Grant Contest

\$20,000 business grants for Black women, plus mentorship and digital tools to help grow Black woman-owned companies. Businesses should bring in under \$3 million annually to be eligible, with preference to businesses with an annual revenue over \$50,000. **Deadline: Dec. 31.**

HerRise Micro-Grant

Provides financial assistance to women of color that are often unable to secure funding for their small business and creating innovative solutions that impact their community. **Applications accepted monthly and due at the end of each month.**

Hello Alice Small Business Growth Fund

\$5,000-\$25,000 grants to for-profit, small businesses with less than \$1M in 2022 gross annual revenue. **Deadline: Oct. 27.**

The Women's Economic Self-Sufficiency Team, or WESST, is a statewide 501(c)(3) small business assistance organization committed to supporting individuals in New Mexico who want to start a business or improve the performance of an existing one.

WESST's core services include business consulting, training, incubation, and access to capital. They employ a "no barriers to entry" approach, which means there are no prerequisites that clients have to present, nor do they have to "qualify" or be "selected" for assistance.

Fair Housing Initiatives Program (FHIP)

the Fair Housing Act (FHA). Deadline: November 30.

Conservation Innovation Grant (CIG)

Program aims to stimulate the development and adoption of innovative conservation approaches and technologies in conjunction with agricultural production. Projects should lead to the transfer of conservation technologies, management systems, and innovative approaches (such as market-based systems) to agricultural producers through the development of technical manuals, guides, and practical instruction for the private sector. **Deadline: October 30.**

Community Food Projects Competitive Grant Program

Brings together stakeholders from distinct parts of the food system to foster understanding of national food security trends and how they might improve local food systems. Understanding that low-income individuals experience disproportionate access to healthy foods, projects should address food and nutrition security, particularly among our nation's most vulnerable populations. **Deadline: October 30.**
