New Mexico Film Office Announces Untitled Vince Gilligan Series Filming in New Mexico

Santa Fe, NM—New Mexico Film Office Director Amber Dodson announced today that an untitled Vince Gilligan project is filming in and around Albuquerque.

The production will employ over 1,400 New Mexicans, including 500+ crew members, 100+ principal actors, and 800+ background talent.

The series will star Rhea Seehorn ("Better Call Saul") and be executive produced by Vince Gilligan ("Breaking Bad," "Better Call Saul").

"I'm thrilled to be working in New Mexico again," Gilligan stated. "Story-wise, this new show could have been set anywhere in the United States. However, I keep returning to the Land of Enchantment for the beautifully cinematic landscape and to continue working with the best crew ever.
