Harvie's contributions also include collaborating with Creative Startups, Vital Spaces, and Poeh Cultural Center on a <u>CID study</u> and a progress report, "<u>Investing in New Mexico's Heart and Soul</u>," <u>securing \$1.8</u> million in CID grants, and supporting the inaugural Creative Industries Week this June.

Creative Industries are a critical piece of New Mexico's history and culture, and I believe it is one of our biggest and most unique strengths," Harvie said. "The five years I've spent at EDD have allowed me to exercise my creativity at the intersections of business and community development, and I'm excited to continue that work for the Creative Industries Division."

Harvie holds a degree from the University of New Mexico Anderson School of Management and is an alumna of the New Mexico School for the Arts, where she studied music. She is passionate about aiding underserved communities in navigating complex systems and brings a collaborative, strategic approach to all her endeavors.
