A newly structured line of credit, made by 7(a) lenders and backed by the SBA, to give greater flexibility than a traditional term loan.

<u>State Small Business Credit Initiative</u> <u>Technical Assistance Program (SSBCI TA)</u>

Offers funding opportunities, mentorship, and support tailored specifically to New Mexico small businesses. Program assistance is available in Spanish and English.

USDA Wood Innovations Program

Proposals for the *Community Wood Grant* and *Wood Products Infrastructure Assistance Grant* should support crucial links between resilient, healthy forests, strong rural economies, and jobs in the forestry sector.

Deadline: December 18.

Rural Energy for America Program

Provides guaranteed loan financing and grant funding for rural small businesses and agricultural producers to implement renewable energy systems or make energy efficiency improvements. **Deadline: December 31 and March 31.**

New Mexico Quantum Technologies Award Pilot Program

The <u>New Mexico Quantum Technologies Award Pilot Program</u> is a competitive statefunded grant that awards non-dilutive funds to early-stage companies working in quantum technologies. Eligible companies must be located in New Mexico or establish a presence in New Mexico.

Five awards of \$100,000 each will be used toward company activity in New Mexico and awardees will agree to maintain their company presence in the state for a minimum of two years. Awards made by this pilot program cannot be the first money in — previously secured funding from additional sources is required.

The New Mexico Quantum Technologies Award Pilot Program will be accepting applications on a **rolling basis through May 30, 2025.**

Community Resources

NM Catalog of Local Assistance Programs (The Grant Plant)

Contains programs administered by the State of New Mexico and the Federal Government intended to assist local entities by matching their unique needs and goals with available resources.

Tribal College Initiative Grants

Provides funding to Land Grant Institutions to make capital improvements and purchase equipment.

USDA Rural Energy Savings Program

Provides loans to rural utilities and other companies that provide loans to qualified consumers to implement durable cost-effective energy efficiency measures.

Route 66 Centennial Project Proposals

Projects and activities submitted for review that meet the evaluation criteria will be endorsed by the Coordination Group and submitted to the U.S. Route 66 Centennial Commission as an official Route 66 Centennial project. **Applications accepted on a rolling basis.**

Self-Help Homeownership Opportunity Program

This program is for national and regional nonprofit organizations and consortia to facilitate and encourage innovative homeownership opportunities on a national, geographically diverse basis through self-help homeownership housing programs. **Deadline December 17.**

Tribal Energy Development Capacity Grant

Seeks to develop the Tribal management, organizational, and technical capacity needed to maximize the economic impact of energy resource development on Federally recognized Tribal land. **Deadline January 16, 2025.**

Tribal Colleges and Universities Head Start Partnership Program Grants

Provides competitive funding for Tribal colleges and universities for the purpose of establishing or enhancing partnerships with Head Start programs that effectively increase the number of qualified education staff working in American Indian Alaska Native Head Start and Early Head Start programs. **Deadline: January 21, 2025.**

Tribal Clean Energy Planning and Development Grant

Supports Tribal entities to conduct clean energy planning, comprehensively assess the feasibility and viability of deploying clean energy technology, or conduct clean energy design and development activities. **Deadline: January 23.**

Rural Health Care Services Outreach Program

Grant program supports organizations that promote and deliver rural health care services by strengthening local resources and capacity in rural communities. **Deadline: January 27.**

Rural Business Development Grant

Promotes economic development and job creation in rural areas by providing grant funding for either business opportunity grants or business enterprise grants to local/county/state governments, nonprofits, and Tribal entities. **Deadline: February 28, 2025.**

Community Wildfire Defense Grant

Grant supports communities in restoring and maintaining landscapes, creating fire-adapted communities, and improving wildfire responses. **Deadline: February 28.**
