Provides guaranteed loan financing and grant funding for rural small businesses and agricultural producers to implement renewable energy systems or make energy efficiency improvements. **Deadline: March 31.**

Community Resources

Rural Business Development Grant

Promotes economic development and job creation in rural areas by providing grant funding for either business opportunity grants or business enterprise grants to local, county, and state governments, nonprofits, and Tribal entities. **Deadline: February 28.**

Santa Fe Community Foundation Spring Grant Cycle

Accepting proposals from organizations serving Santa Fe, Mora, Rio Arriba, and San Miguel Counties. **Application window: February 3 - March 9.**

Community Wildfire Defense Grant

Grant supports communities in restoring and maintaining landscapes, creating fire-adapted communities, and improving wildfire responses. **Deadline: February 28.**

Cultural Properties Restoration Fund

Up to \$250,000 grants to state agencies and other political subdivisions to fund historic preservation efforts. Guidance webinars on February 5 and 26. **Deadline: March 18.**

NMDA Healthy Soil Program

Provides grants to local government entities with proven land management to support healthy soil to implement projects that support at least one of the five soil health principles: keeping soil covered; minimizing soil disturbance on cropland and minimizing external inputs; maximizing biodiversity; maintaining a living root; integrating animals into land management, including grazing animals, birds, beneficial insects or keystone species, such as earthworms. **Deadline March 19.**

Promoting Internet Needs of New Mexicans (PINON) Grant

Grants from \$25,000-\$500,000 to support subgrantees in enhancing their digital equity programs tailored for populations vulnerable to digital exclusion. **Deadline: March 21.**

Connectivity to Declared Disaster Areas Grant

Infrastructure grants for broadband deployment to unserved and underserved communities impacted by environmental disasters, including wildfires and floods. **Deadline: March 21.**
