Local Youth and Creative Industries

Two Student Interns

- Planned and conducted art activities for "The Young Entrepreneurs" student classes
- Visited local galleries, attended openings and wrote reports of their experience.
- Created social media venues to showcase local artists and galleries
- Journaled and discussed issues that arose, both positive and negative
- Engaged in CI training and workshop sessions



Young Entrepreneurs Classes

- 8-week Program with H2 Academic Solutions
- Designed to teach them the basics of creating marketing tools using art techniques.
- Used various art forms to help the participating students: Develop a business brand; Create a logo; Design a mascot; and Write a slogan.
- Students then created business card prototypes, tee shirts and tote bags with their brands.



Local Youth and Creative Industries

Student Art Program

- 4 art Classes, 4 local artist instructors, 35 students
- The Student Interns recruited students to participate in classes
- Learned to use acrylics, mixed media, poured resin, and wood sculpture




